

GOMEZ IN FORM SHADES NERVOUS YOUNG CUB ACE

YANKEE STADIUM, Sept. 29.—(AP)—The following play by play description of the second game of the world series is by Alan Gould, sports editor of the Associated Press.

First Inning.

CUBS: The hand struck up the national anthem as the Yankees galloped out onto the field. The opening picture was a big contrast to yesterday's gloomy getaway.

Herman up. Strike one, swinging at a curve. Herman drove a double down the third base line.

English up. Ball one, ball two. Strike one. Foul, strike two. English hoisted to Combs. Herman held second.

Cuyler up. Ball one, inside. Cuyler bounced to Crosetti and was safe on the young shortstop's fumble. Herman stopped at third.

Stephenson up. Ball one. Foul, strike one. Strike two, called Gomez threw to first. Stephenson popped to Combs and Herman raced home after the catch. Cuyler remained at first.

Demaree up. Ball one. Strike one. Foul, strike two. Ball two, wide. Demaree fled out to Ruth.

One run, one hit, one error, one left.

YANKEES: Combs up. Strike one. Ball one. Strike two. Foul. Ball two. Ball three. Combs walked on fourth wide pitch.

Sewell up. Ball one, Hartnett went out to confer with Warneke. Ball two, ball three, strike one. Sewell walked when another pitch failed to break toward the plate. The Cubs went over to back up their young pitcher.

Ruth up. Strike one, strike two. Ball one. Ruth fanned, swinging at a slow curve.

Gehrig up. Strike one. Ball one. Ball two. Hartnett threw to second, but Combs slid back safely. Ball three, strike two. It was a beautiful low curve. Combs scored and Sewell went to second on Gehrig's line single to right. Grimm missed a dive for the ball.

Lazzeri up. Strike one. Lazzeri fouled to Hartnett.

Dickey up. Ball one, strike one, strike two, swinging. Warneke was getting a great break on his curves. Ball two, Dickey singled off Grimm's glove and Sewell scored. Gehrig reacting third, beating the relay from Hartnett.

Chapman up. Ball one, Strike one. Ball two. Strike two. Chapman fanned on a third called strike.

Two runs, two hits, no errors, two left.

Second Inning.

CUBS: Grimm up; ball one. Grimm smashed a single to center. Hartnett up; ball one, strike one, ball two, ball three. Hartnett walked. Jurgens bunted to Gomez and was thrown out at first as both runners advanced on the sacrifice. Warneke

up; strike one, ball one, ball two, strike two. Warneke fanned, swinging at fast ball. Herman up; ball one, strike one, foul, strike two. Herman fanned, taking a third called strike, and Gomez was out of a bad hole.

No runs, one hit, no errors, two left.

YANKEES: Crosetti up; strike one. Crosetti popped to Jurgens. Gomez up; strike one, swinging; strike two, swinging. Gomez struck out on a called third strike. Combs up; ball one, strike two. Combs fled out to Cuyler.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Third Inning.

CUBS: English up; ball one, ball two, strike one, ball three, strike two; English fled to Ruth who made the catch without moving a step. Cuyler up; ball one, strike one, ball two; Cuyler grounded out. Lazzeri to Gehrig. Stephenson up; ball one, ball two; Stephenson punched a hit to right and made two bases when the ball bounded past Ruth. It was scored as a double. Demaree up; ball one, ball two, ball three, strike one; Demaree fouled; Demaree singled to right and Stephenson scored standing up when Ruth fumbled the ball before making a poor throw to the plate. Grimm up; strike one, strike two, foul, ball one, ball two; Demaree was trapped off first base and put out. Gomez to Gehrig.

One run, two hits, no errors, none left.

YANKEES: Sewell up. Strike one. Sewell bounced out, Herman to Grimm.

Ruth up. Ball one, Ball two. Strike one. Foul, strike two. Ball three. Ruth walked.

Gehrig up. Ball one. Ball two. Strike one. Gehrig singled on a sharp hit that Herman barely was able to stop. Ruth held second.

Lazzeri up. Ball one. Foul, strike one. Ball two. Lazzeri rolled to Jurgens and was called out on a close play at first. Ruth advanced to third and Gehrig to second.

Dickey up. Dickey was purposely walked on four wide pitches, filling the bases.

Chapman up. Chapman singled to right, scoring Ruth and Gehrig. Dickey stopped at second.

Crosetti up. Foul, strike one. Strike two. Ball one. Crosetti fanned on a third called strike.

Two runs, two hits, no errors, two left.

Fourth Inning.

Grimm up. Ball one, high. Grimm slashed a single off Sewell's glove.

Hartnett up. Strike one. Strike two. Hartnett struck out, with his bat still on his shoulder.

Jurgens up. Jurgens forced Grimm. Crosetti to Lazzeri.

Warneke up. Strike one. Strike two. Warneke whiffed.

No runs, one hit, no errors, none left.

YANKEES: Gomez up. Gomez was thrown out. Warneke to Grimm.

Combs up. Strike one. Ball one. Ball two. Foul, strike two. Ball three. Combs singled through short.

Sewell up. On the hit and run play, Sewell singled to left and Combs reached third.

Ruth up. Ruth batted to Warneke and Combs was trapped between third and home. He was tagged out and then an unusual double play was completed when Hartnett and

Jurgens trapped Sewell. Jurgens made the final putout. Hartnett was credited with the putout of Combs.

No runs, two hits, no errors, one left.

Fifth Inning.

CUBS: Herman up. Strike one. Strike two. Ball one. Ball two. Herman fanned.

English up. Strike one Strike two. English was called out on strikes.

Cuyler up. Ball one, high. Cuyler drove a triple to deep right field. Ruth just failed to get under the ball as it dropped a foot outside the bleacher wall.

Stephenson up. Strike one. Ball one. Ball two. Ball three. Stephenson grounded out on a high bouncer, Sewell to Gehrig.

No runs, one hit, no errors, one left.

YANKEES: Gehrig up. Ball one, high. Ball two. Gehrig hit his third straight single past Herman.

Lazzeri up. Strike one. Ball one. Lazzeri grounded to Herman, who fumbled, but recovered in time to nip the batter at first. Gehrig reached second.

Dickey up. Strike one. Ball one. Dickey lashed a single to right scoring Gehrig.

Chapman up. Ball one. Strike one. Ball two. Klem reversed his decision and made it strike two. Ball two. Ball three. Chapman fanned to Dickey was thrown out trying to steal second. Hartnett to Jurgens.

One run, two hits, no errors, one left.

Sixth Inning.

Demaree up. Demaree lifted a high fly to Chapman.

Grimm up. Strike one. Grimm grounded out to Gehrig unassisted.

Hartnett up. Strike one. Ball one. Strike two. Hartnett kicked. Hartnett grounded out, Crosetti to Gehrig.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

YANKEES: Crosetti fled out to Demaree, who made a sensational running catch in left center, near the running track.

Gomez up. Strike one. Strike two. Gomez fanned, swinging.

Combs up. Strike one. Combs grounded out, Herman to Grimm.

CUBS: Jurgens up. Strike one. Jurgens hoisted to Ruth.

Warneke up. Ball one. Foul, strike one. Strike two. Warneke fanned on a third called strike.

Herman up. Strike one. Strike two. Gomez was getting a nice hop on his fast ones. Ball one. Herman lifted a short fly to Combs.

No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

YANKEES: Sewell up. Strike one. Foul, strike two. Ball one. Sewell grounded out, Herman to Grimm.

Ruth up. Ruth singled on a drive that bounced off the rightfield wall.

Gehrig up. Ball one. Ball two. Gehrig grounded to Herman and the Cubs completed a double play. Herman to Jurgens to Grimm.

No runs, one hit, no errors, none left.

Eighth Inning.
