WASHINGTON, Oct. 12. (AP) - Louis Johnson, national commander of the American Legion, issued a statement today in which he said that neither the bonus nor prohibition will be "allowed to draw the Legion into politics at this time." Previously Johnson paid his respects to President Hoover at the White House. His statement follows: "The mandates of the national convention held in Portland recently on both the immediate payment of adjusted compensation and the prohibition question are written in plain words. When the proper and effective time comes, these mandates will be carried out and every Legion official, member and organization will be requested and expected to support the will of the majority as expressed by that convention. "Neither is a political question, so far as the Legion is concerned, and they will not be allowed to draw the Legion into politics at this time."
