GOVERNORS WILL GUN ON SAGEBRUSH RANCH WITH 'BILL' HANLEY

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 13 (AP)—Ontario, Oregon, is slated to be the scene of an important conference Friday when the governors of Idaho, Nevada, California and Oregon get together there to see who can shoot the most Chinese pheasants. Announcement of the arrangements, made here today, said Governor James Rolph, Jr., of California, and Governor Fred B. Balzar of Nevada would leave Sacramento Friday noon by airplane with Colonel Roscoe Turner, speed flier, at the controls, for Ontario, to be met there by Governors C. Ben Ross of Idaho and Julius L. Meier of Oregon. In the party also will be Earl B. Gilmore, California state game and fish commissioner, and William P. Benedict, Rolph's former secretary. The announcement said a 15,000-acre stretch of sagebrush land had been set aside for the "conference," which is to take place on the opening day of the pheasant season. The announcement named "Bill" Hanley, eastern Oregon cattleman, as one of the hosts.
