Two more evenly matched teams never stood face to face at a kickoff. The Sons' line will average right close to 183 pounds while the Badgers will hit a mean at 181 pounds to the man. The backfields, while not so close in weight, appear to be about the same on paper, at least. Hobson's starting backs average 176 pounds while those of Jenne hit at 168, but what the Badgers lack in weight is made up in speed and the finished execution of the tricky formations used by Jenne offset the difference of a few pounds. In addition, the Pacific backfield is made up or seasoned veterans in every position while Hobson will have three new men and one letterman, the flashy negro, Claude Hines.

Reserves Must Wait

The lest minute onstaught made on first string positions by the reserves in sorimmage seasons all week may mean that some of them are likely to see action before the game is over, but it is probable that Hobson will use his most experienced performers at the beginning. The Teachers' lineup will likely be practically the same as the one which opened against California Aggles in Bacramento two weeks ago with the fast coming reserves being held ready to go into the fray at the first sign of any weakening.
