

AUDACIOUS THUGS RAID JAIL; TAKE GUNS, RUM, CASH

CROOKSTON, Minn., Oct. 22. (AP)—Five audacious criminals raided the city jail today and fled with a truck load of plunder. Arousing sleeping policemen to seal their eyes and mouths with adhesive tape, the robbers carried away a machine gun, police pistols and rifles, 600 rounds of ammunition, liquor, \$500 in cash and 20 slot machines with their contents, estimated by authorities at about \$500.

BRITON SEES NO DEPRESSION HERE

Experiencing a rough air trip from Walla Walla, Wash., and catching the Medford-bound train from Portland by thirty seconds, Major Yeats-Brown arrived in Medford Saturday afternoon for his speaking engagement at the high school last night. Alighting from the plane, he expressed the belief that "everybody should fly."

Major Yeats-Brown has just returned from Russia, where he was sent by a Liberal English newspaper, which favored bolshevism. He stated that although conditions are terrible in that country, he believes they will become much worse. Several crop failures and the inability of the Russian peasants to master the combines and tractors imported from America were among the reasons given by the famous writer and sportsman.

UNKNOWN MAN IN CROSSING DEATH

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 22.—(AP)—An unidentified man, about 25, was killed when his automobile collided with an S. P. & S. train here tonight. He died in an ambulance en route to a hospital, apparently from a fractured skull.

James Welch of Vancouver, Wash., conductor of the train, and T. Blake of Portland, engineer, told police they were traveling slowly into the railroad yards when the coupe crashed into the locomotive behind the cylinder. The driver was thrown to the curb and the front of his car demolished.

Neither Wins—In the suit of the Commercial Finance corporation versus J. R. Purcell and L. D. Parks, neither the plaintiff nor the defendant was awarded any money, according to the verdict returned Friday night by the circuit court jury, of which Donald S. Clark was foreman.
