TYPIST HELD FOR POLITICIAN'S END IN WEIRD DEATH

SEATTLE, Oct. 24.—(AP)—The shooting of Col. William M. Inglis, a World War veteran and a one-time candidate for United States senator, was studied by authorities today with the version given by a woman who was in the apartment at the time and was critically wounded.

The woman, who declared that she and Inglis had been married recently but who was known to her associates as Miss Mary Nash and who had been employed as a stenographer by Inglis, was at a hospital today with a bullet wound in her leg and abdomen. Her condition was "fair," hospital attendants said, but she was not out of danger.

Rushed to the hospital after the tragedy was discovered Saturday night, when she put in a hysterical telephone call to the night switchboard operator, she pleaded "let me die! Let me die!" on reviving somewhat yesterday, she declined to describe the affair until Attorney Edgar H. Hadley, a former close friend of Colonel Inglis, was summoned.

"I had been drinking hard for a week," detectives quoted her as saying, "and when we awakened Saturday morning he seemed to feel low. 'I can't go on this way,' he said. 'But he went on drinking and he had that gun. I thought I had it hidden. But he found it.'"

FRANCE DILATORY UPON PAYMENTS OF DEBT INTEREST

(Continued from Page One) would be solved before the date the interest is due, December 15. French opinion recognizes that the problem is complicated by the so-called "commercial debt" due on war stock purchases—a debt which is linked to the so-called "political debt" but which France accepts must be paid.

TURIN, Italy, Oct. 24.—(AP)—Premiere Benito Mussolini wants the United States to cancel or reduce Europe's war debts. He voiced the suggestion in an address last night. The occasion was his first visit to this industrial center 40 miles from the French frontier, which heretofore has been long the hot-bed of anti-fascism.

The visit comes in the last week of the first decade of fascism, and the premier chose Turin to give Italy the slogan for the next decade: "Advance, work, and if and when necessary, fight."

He ran the gamut of international and national problems in his 25-minute address, which was preceded by five minutes of shouting by the crowd. Mussolini proclaimed for "all to peace" that Italy follows a policy of peace—"true peace designed to restore the equilibrium of Europe, peace that is in the heart like hope and faith."

The premier envisaged, however, a four-power conference among Great Britain, France, Germany and Italy as a possible solution of Europe's troubles. Such a conference was proposed by Great Britain after Germany demanded arms equality.

Thomas said the governor of New York state and democratic presidential nominee "was more obedient to Tammany than any other governor in recent years" and since the resignation of Mayor Walker as mayor of New York City "is trading his endorsement of a Tammany man . . . for machine support at the polls."

3 BURN WHEN CAR HITS BRIDGE POST TACOMA, Oct. 24.—(AP)—A man believed to be Herschel Brown, of Seattle, a woman and a seven or eight year old girl were burned to death here last night when their car crashed into the blinker light at the Puyallup river bridge on the Pacific highway and burst into flames. Such identification as was possible was made from papers with were not entirely destroyed by the flames. The bodies were burned beyond identification. A small dog in the car was also burned to death.

FISH MIGRATION ALSO IMPROVING Marked improvement in fish migration conditions in the Rogue were reported here today by Ralph Cowgill, following a survey of the river, where much work is being done to aid the fish in their travels up the river. At Savage Rapids dam, where need of a fish ladder on the highway side has been discussed during the past several months, a rock wall has been constructed and a pool opened under the spillway so that until the gates are put in the dam, the fish will be able to make the trip up the river without difficulty. This will aid the salmon run in the spring and the steelhead and silverhead runs in the fall.

Work on the ladder at Gold Bay is also being done this week. On this side of the river a pool has been constructed and the rock above blasted out to keep the water going over the ladder at all times. The ladder on the other side of the river has been rebuilt.
