MRS. SISLEY WAS TRUE PIONEER OF FRONTIER WEST

Mrs. Letitia Sisley, better known to her friends as Grandma Sisley, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Eva DeWitt, at Medford, Cal., October 20. Mrs. Sisley was born in Ohio in 1849, and came to Oregon as a young bride in the early 70's, settling in Baker county, near the Snake Indian reservation, and was there when the Snake and Willamette Indians were on the warpath, but she and the children had always been friendly with the Indians and so they were not molested, though for several days they kept up their war dance before going, and finally passing through their field.
