

Letter to Salade Refutes Claim of Democrat No Campaign Funds Asked

Louis A. Salade, Jr. of the Central Point district, has a letter signed by James A. Farley, chairman of the Democratic national committee, dated October 8, from New York City soliciting funds for the Roosevelt campaign fund, and stating Farley's claim of November 1, "that we have never solicited campaign funds from anyone, Canadian or American," as carried in press dispatches.

The letter follows:

"Mr. Louis Salade, Jr.,
Central Point, Ore.
Dear Mr. Salade:

"I am taking the liberty of writing this letter to you at the suggestion of Mr. George M. Williamson, a mutual friend, who is here with us at headquarters in New York.

"It is the conviction of many people, regardless of political affiliations, that our country needs a change in the administration of its public affairs.

"The only way to effect this change in 1933 is to elect Franklin D. Roosevelt. If you are sympathetic with this view, we shall greatly appreciate any financial assistance you may be willing to accord us towards meeting the expenses of a very economically planned campaign.

"If this suggestion meets with your approval, may I express the hope that

the measure of such assistance will be the largest contribution which both your interest in the cause and your personal circumstances will permit.

"Checks should be drawn to the order of the Treasurer, Democratic National Campaign Committee, Biltmore hotel, New York City. I am enclosing a personally addressed envelope for your convenience.

A press dispatch of November 1 said:

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1. — (AP) — The Republican National committee said today that statements by Democratic Chairman James A. Farley "indicate that he is adept at practicing the ancient political adage: Never let the right hand know what the left hand is doing."

'RICHEST WOMAN'S' WEALTH DWINDLED

CHICAGO, Nov. 4. — (AP) — An inventory of the estate of the late Mrs. Edith Rockefeller McCormick, showing the once "world's richest woman" owned \$1,032,248 worth of personal property at her death—was filed today in probate court.

A bill of appraisement valued the late Chicago social dictator's jewels at \$777,567. Included in the collection made famous at opera openings and social affairs was her pearl necklace—valued at \$405,584 in comparison with its original reported purchase price of \$1,200,000.

No estimate was included in the inventory of the value of Mrs. McCormick's real estate.

News Notes of County Schools

Miss Brinker, county school supervisor of Klamath county spent Thursday and Friday in Jackson county, visiting the Southern Oregon Normal school and the rural schools of the county.

The rural school supervisor is appealing to the people of this county for aid in caring for the children who are not sufficiently nourished to be able to spend a profitable day in school work. In many districts the younger children should have milk served to them sometime about mid-way of the morning session and a hot lunch at noon. The situation appears to be more serious than in former years. Any family able to spare milk is asked to notify the teacher in that particular district, and she will make the necessary arrangements.

The one and two-room schools are making renewed efforts this fall to maintain their schools in a clean and hygienic manner. There is need for quantities of clean squares of old white cotton or linen cloth to be used for handkerchiefs. Combs, too, are needed. Combs which have been broken in two pieces may be sterilized and used for pocket-combs. One boy was noticed trying to make a rebellious mop of hair behave, using a broken bit of comb not over two inches long and containing but a few of its original teeth. He did a pretty good job of it, too. Many of the children have no combs of any description with which to keep their hair in order. Contributions to the cleanliness campaign may be left at the superintendent's office or at any of the schools.

Arthur L. Peck, professor of landscape gardening at Oregon State college, says in a recent letter to school officials here: "I would say that school grounds generally are probably the next most neglected of any public or semi-public grounds which we have. The first priority would be cleaned as the old country cemetery."

The teachers' chorus will meet Saturday, November 4th, at the Senior high school, at 10:30 a.m. All teachers of the county are welcome. One hour is devoted to chorus singing, with 30 minutes given to questions of public school music discussed with Miss Baldwin, director of the chorus.

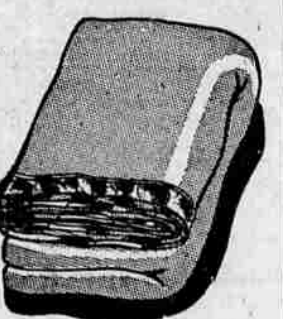
