

RANCH PAIR LOSE \$7500 TO BUNCO GAME OPERATORS

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Nov. 4.—(AP)—A Calaveras county rancher and his wife reported to Sacramento police last night they had been swindled out of \$7500 by two bunco men who took their money in a hotel room yesterday and left Sacramento a few hours later.

The couple, Mr. and Mrs. A. P. Nelson of Copperopolis, told Detective Sergeant Ralph S. Towers the men said they had a "hot tip" on a race at Tanforan, in which a horse named "Piracy" was to place, and that if they bet \$7500 on the horse they would "clean up a fortune."

Nelson said the men gave the names of C. Thompson and J. C. Walnwright and that they approached him at San Jose several days ago, proposing at first to buy his ranch. Later they said they had found a pocketbook with some "inside dope" on a race at Tanforan that would "make them all rich."

The bunco men met with Nelson and his wife in the Hotel Senator today and the \$7500 changed hands. The division of the spoils was to have been made at Salem, Ore.

FARMER MURDERS SONS IN QUARREL

LAPEER, Mich., Nov. 4.—(AP)—Gabriel Kostas, a farmer living near Clifford, Mich., today shot and killed his two sons, Steve, 16, and Tony, 14, and then shot himself to death following a family quarrel.

Sheriff Byron Courter said Kostas first shot the elder son, Steve, in a barn, then went to the house where Tony Kostas was asleep, shot him in the head with a shotgun and returned to the barn where he ended his own life.

Courter said a housekeeper in the Kostas home informed him the father had been quarreling for several days with the sons over money obtained from produce.

MISSIONARY SLAIN BY BANDITS IS BELIEF

HANKOW, China, Nov. 4.—(AP)—The belief that the Rev. Bert Nelson, American missionary held by bandits in Hupeh province for two years, had been slain, was strengthened today by further Chinese reports.

These reports, from Sinyang, quoted communist officers captured from groups affiliated with the one holding Nelson, as saying Mr. Nelson had been shot because he couldn't keep up with the fleeing forces.

Steiner Pleads For G. O. P. Solons

LA GRANDE, Ore., Nov. 4.—(AP)—Declaring that a change in administration or defeat of western senators, with consequent loss of important committee chairmanships would be a serious blow to the west, Senator Frederick Steiner of Oregon spoke to a crowd of 300 Union county voters here last night. The senator stopped here for a few hours en route to Portland from Baker.

Nature Doctor's Slayer Convicted

SEATTLE, Nov. 4.—(AP) John Zerfas, 35, was convicted by a jury in superior court today for first degree murder for the shooting of Arthur Jackson, 45, "Naturactor," last September. The jury, out 17 hours, recommended life imprisonment.

Zerfas shot Jackson after Mrs. Orpha Zerfas, his wife and a nurse in Jackson's office, told him Jackson had killed and embraced her.

Wheat Prices Hit New Low Records

PORTLAND, Nov. 4.—(AP)—The price offered for average wheat on Camas and Nez Perce prairie today is not above 10c a bushel with much of the supply not worth above 7-9c a bushel. At Pendleton and Walla Walla the average wheat is 20c a bushel at the producer. This means after all charges are eliminated.

Five Women Die In Auto Crash

RICHMOND, Va., Nov. 4.—(AP)—Five women were killed today in an automobile-train crash at Greendale. The dead are: Mrs. Grace Land, 40; Mrs. W. H. Lane, driver of the car; Mrs. E. R. Metz, 30; Miss Mary Stone, 17, and Mrs. A. H. Henley, 45. All were residents of Laurel, Va.

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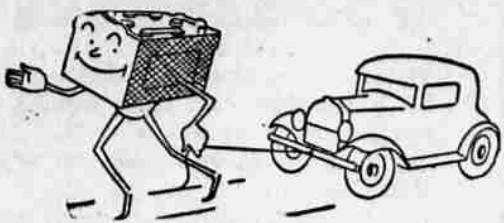

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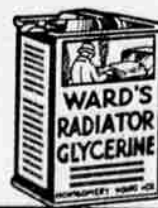

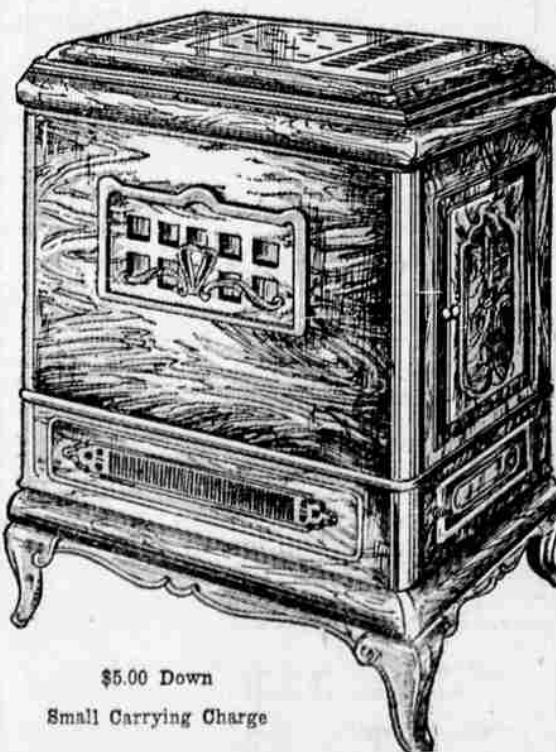
