HYDE PARK, N. Y., Nov. 7.—(AP)—Twenty-two years ago, Franklin D. Roosevelt, known chiefly as a young man with an interest in politics, chugged down the Hudson River valley in a none too reliable automobile to make his first campaign speech at Beacon.

Today he visits Beacon again, the Democratic candidate for the presidency. Tomorrow the voters of the nation weigh that candidacy at the polls.

Beacon is one of several Hudson valley cities he will visit on a motor trip, scheduled to leave his Krum Elbow home at 3 o'clock. He will speak in the Beacon public square, the scene of his maiden effort as a campaigner.
