

SQUAD WILL BUILD DEFENSE AGAINST JEFFERSON PLAYS

Tigers to Train Hard in Days Remaining Before Journey to Meet Portland Champs — Dry Field Is Hope

Medford high school football squad which plays Jefferson high of Portland Thanksgiving day for the mythical state title, will practice the art of stopping Jefferson high plays this evening and tomorrow. The squad of 25 players will leave Wednesday morning for the metropolis and will limber up Thanksgiving morning on the field of battle.

Portland information lists the two teams as even and a classic battle is forecast. Jefferson has the defensive power and Medford is rated higher in offensive. The Portland team scored 87 points the past season, Medford 214 against opponents.

Coach Burgher and local fans are praying for a dry field and a dry ball. This will give the Burgher-masters a chance to spring their flashy forward pass attack. The team is taking the contest with more seriousness than usual, and there is not a trace of over-confidence, so manifest in the Grants Pass game.

The teams are even as to weight in the line, according to the paper figures, with Jefferson holding a three-pound advantage in the back-field. This is nothing to worry about. The Jefferson attack centers around Fransen, their fullback, and Woodward, their quarter. These two will get a careful watching Thanksgiving afternoon.

Hood River loses. Lebanon defeated the highly touted Hood River team, 13 to 6, Saturday night at Portland, and the victory will silence any lamentations from the mid-Columbia section that Medford and Portland conspired to rob them of the state title, and both were afraid to play them. The Lebanon team outplayed Hood River. The Dalles unmercifully trounced La Grande, another state title claimant. Lebanon, Chemawa and Tillamook are the three squads left in the state with any right to file claims. Hood River defeated Chemawa, 7 to 0.

Both Strings Going. Medford players going to Portland will include the first and second strings and a couple of water boys. The high school band, under direction of F. Wilson Wait, will leave Wednesday night and will play during the game.

All Medford gridmen are in good physical condition, though a few still suffer from colds. There will be no hard scrimmages the coming two days as no chances will be taken on last-minute injuries.

CALLISON'S CREW MEETS GAELS IN TURKEY DAY TILT

Many Games Listed On Coast Gridiron Front—Trojan-Husky, Bruin-Cougar Clashes Main Interest

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21.—(AP)—On two widely separated gridirons this week, the joint leaders of the Pacific Coast conference, Southern California's Trojans and the University of California at Los Angeles Bruins, will stake their championship chances against worthy football foes.

The Trojans, undefeated in or out of the conference, and with but a single touchdown scored against them to date, will wind up their conference activities, opposing Washington's Huskies at Seattle Thanksgiving day.

Gaels record best. On the same day, in their home sector, the Bruins of U. C. L. A. will seek their fifth conference win at the expense of the increasingly formidable Washington State Cougars.

While the two important conference engagements are being completed mid-week, another turkey day encounter will pit St. Mary's Gaels against University of Oregon at San Francisco. St. Mary's had the best record among the far west's independent teams this year, with only one defeat listed, by Fordham. The Saints also played to a 12-12 tie with California.

Oregon completed its conference schedule with two wins, two defeats and one tie. In three previous games with Oregon, St. Mary's has won.

Another Thanksgiving day tilt will oppose Idaho against Utah's Aggies. Stanford and California wound up their conference season Saturday by playing a scoreless tie. The Stanford team, which finished its most disastrous conference season since Coach Glenn Warner took charge in 1924, was en route to Pittsburgh today, to meet the Panthers next Saturday. California also has an inter-sectional game coming up with Georgia Tech at Berkeley, December 17.

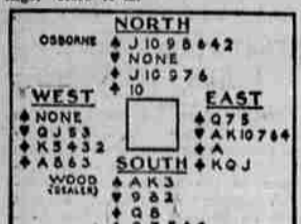

TIPS on Contract

TRIUMPHANT SHUT-OUT. By Tom O'Neill. A pre-emptive overbid often is used successfully by a player who senses that vulnerable opponents have game or slam possibilities. Because of vulnerability and the danger that partner may have no aid, an opponent of the preemptive bidder will hesitate to overcall even with a strong hand.



After south and west correctly passed, it occurred to Osborne that the freakish distribution of his hand indicated that east had plenty of tickets. So he bid four spades, reconciling himself to being set with the consolation that game and rubber would be saved, perhaps.

East doubled. The only thing he could do other than double would be to bid five hearts, which would have been quite risky ordinarily in view of silence on his partner's part. A new convention provides for a four no-trump bid over a pre-emptive opening four of a major by an opponent. Such a convention requires partner to bid his longest suit. But one who makes such a no-trump bid must positively be prepared for a response in any suit other than the one bid, and east of course was not ready for a diamond response.

Against Osborne's four-spade contract east led a high heart, which was ruffed in the declarer's hand. Osborne led a low spade to the king, west showing out.

North ruffed a heart and finessed a spade, then caught east's queen of spades and led a diamond from the south hand. West played low and east took the trick with the ace, leading a club.
