THANKSGIVING DAY PROCLAMATION IS ISSUED BY MEIER

SALISBURY, Nov. 21.—(AP)—A Thanksgiving day proclamation written by Governor Julius L. Meier before he left for California was released here last night, setting November 24th aside as a public holiday. Meier's proclamation read:

"The turn of the year brings us again to our annual day of thanksgiving, which has continued as an established institution throughout the life of our nation.

"As we draw near to this day which is a heritage from the Pilgrim Fathers, let us give thought to that countless little band who, amidst peril and hardships and facing a future filled with unknown dangers, thanked God for life, for freedom and for opportunity. They prayed not that their path might be made easy, but that they might have divine guidance and strength to endure.

"Let us approach our Thanksgiving festival in the spirit of the founders, thanking God for the abundant gifts of fruitful nature and ingenious science, and beseeching Him to give us wisdom and understanding in our stewardship so that suffering and want shall be banished from our great land.

"Now, therefore, I, Julius L. Meier, governor of the state of Oregon, conform to the proclamation of the President of the United States, do proclaim Thursday, November 24, 1932, as Thanksgiving Day, and do hereby set it aside as a public holiday.

Let us, on this day, give thanks to God for the fulfillment of His ancient promise that while the earth remaineth, seed time and the harvest shall not fail. Let us acknowledge the ties of family affection and renew the bond of health and home. Let us confirm and strengthen the will to peace and brotherhood. Let us give cheerfulness and gladness to those who are in sorrow or need, and let us reverently seek the guidance of Almighty God in the service of mankind."
