

### FORMER RESIDENT ON TRIAL UPSTATE STATUTORY CRIME

Medford witnesses, called in the trial of W. B. Shelley, formerly in the real estate business here, and charged with committing a statutory crime against his 18-year-old daughter in Oregon City, returned to this city yesterday, testimony in the trial having been completed. Called on the case from here were: Dr. A. E. Doan, attending physician in the Shelby family, while they resided here, H. C. Bess, Mrs. Clyde Warnock and C. L. Goff.

Mr. Shelley, a former minister of Estacada, is remembered here as being associated with the firm of Warnock and Shelley in 1929. He was also frequently heard in sermons, broadcast by the Valley Radio church, during his stay in Medford.

While the testimony in the trial had been completed when the Medford witnesses left Oregon City, the attorneys had not yet presented their final plea to the jury.

Shelley is represented in the case by John Collier, Portland attorney, remembered by many people here for his participation as attorney for the defense in the famous D'Autremont trial. He is associated on the present case with Earl Bernard, also of Portland.

The Medford witnesses were called to Oregon City last Sunday.

### GRANGE APPROVES VOLSTEAD, CROP CUT

WINSTON-SALEM, N. C., Nov. 25.—(AP)—Resolutions advocating support of the Volstead act, lower commissions for selling livestock and uniform state laws for regulation of motor vehicles were adopted by the national Grange today as delegates prepared to end their 10-day convention here.

Opposition to "any compulsory reduction in crop acreage" was expressed in another resolution.

The resolution advocating uniform state vehicle laws said the state should be the sole taxing agency for motor vehicles.

"No gasoline tax diversion from highway improvement should be tolerated," the resolution added.

### Wool Market

BOSTON, Nov. 25.—(AP)—The Commercial Bulletin will say tomorrow:  
Another slow week in the wool market is reported. There has been some demand for fine and fine medium wools, mostly as price slightly under current quotations, where a good volume of business probably could be done, but the largest holders of wool have refused to yield in their asking prices, believing that there is potential buying power among the manufacturers of considerable size.

London opened par to 7 per cent under last sales' closing rates, the greater decline being for the lower grades. Opening rates of Tuesday have been maintained through the week.

Mills still are consuming a heavy weight of wool and the piece goods market is reported in healthy condition. Replacements, however, have not been large in wool as yet.

Mohair continues rather dull and prices are unchanged.

### BUTTER UP A CENT; NEW SUPPLY SEEN

PORTLAND, Nov. 25.—(AP)—The recent 50 a pound advance in the butter market here, attributed by many in the trade to manipulation, today had resulted in a one-cent increase in the price of butter. The Tillamook County Creamery association posted what was called a "temporary" one-cent advance and said additional advances may follow if the butter advance is permanent.

The new selling price at Tillamook is 15c for triplets and 16c for loaf, or 17c and 18c to Portland retailers.

While the late session of the produce exchange did nothing to relieve Portland from paying the highest price in the country, several carloads of midwest butter were reported moving in this direction, as well as additional supplies to California and to Seattle.

Easier undertones were generally reflected in the market for eggs here as a result of the late decline in New York. Local undertones, however, continue of fair character.

Market for live chickens was without price change of any sort for the day; the result of previous scant offerings which were cleaned up over the holiday. Springer alone remain weak.

### WHEAT DROPS TO NEW LOW, RECOVERS

CHICAGO, Nov. 25.—(AP)—Wheat smashed the all-time bottom price record today, but later completely recovered.

After tumbling under the bottom-most quotations ever before reached here wheat rose heartily when there was a let-up of hurried selling that had been precipitated by an extraordinary plunge of British exchange to the lowest point in 12 years. Selling of wheat and the action of British exchange were alike ascribed to the controversy over payment of war debts due the United States.
