

CRAIG WOOD WINS OVER STAR FIELD IN S. F. TOURNEY

Title and \$560 Purse Go to Young New Jerseyite Through Defeat of Espinosa On Frozen Fairways

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 13.—(AP)—The title of 1932 San Francisco national match open champions and \$560 went to Craig Wood, blond number from Deal, N. J., as the golfing army headed for southern California fields to carry on the winter tournament season on the west coast.

The 31-year-old former Ryder cup team member claimed top money of the third annual San Francisco tournament by defeating Al Espinosa of Akron, Ohio, in the 36-hole final yesterday.

Close-Fought Battle.
Frozen fairways and icy greens provided a freak setting for the concluding match, but the few hundred fans who braved the chilling weather were treated to a hard, close-fought battle.

Espinosa went into the lead at the first hole and maintained a one or two hole margin throughout the morning round. He finished the first 18 one up, post-18 a medal score of 41-38-79. Wood had 42-38-80. Par for the Lakeside course is 35-36-71.

Improve in Afternoon.
They improved their golf in the afternoon round. Wood having a 37, two over par, for the first nine and playing the eight holes of the incoming stretch one under par. Espinosa chalked up a 38 for the nine and was a stroke over par on the remaining hole.

Espinosa drew down \$344 as the runner-up's share, while the balance of the \$560 purse was distributed to the other match play competitors. The visiting golfers were en route today to prepare for the Pasadena, Los Angeles and other tournaments in southern California.

It was too much for Howell for the Olders, the behemoth ex-Ashland high player, running wild on shots under the basket, to loop in 19 points. Virgil Swanson, Texaco's offensive star, took second honors with 14 points.

Hobson's rangy first-stringers ran away from the starters for Texaco, but when the old men's second team got into the fray the Sons' scoring spree was checked. Texaco showed the need for shooting practice before the return game here later this month.

In the preliminary game the Normal super-rarity trampled a small Ashland high five, 31-10. The youngsters played a nice floor game, but lacked anyone who could hit the blackboard on shots.
