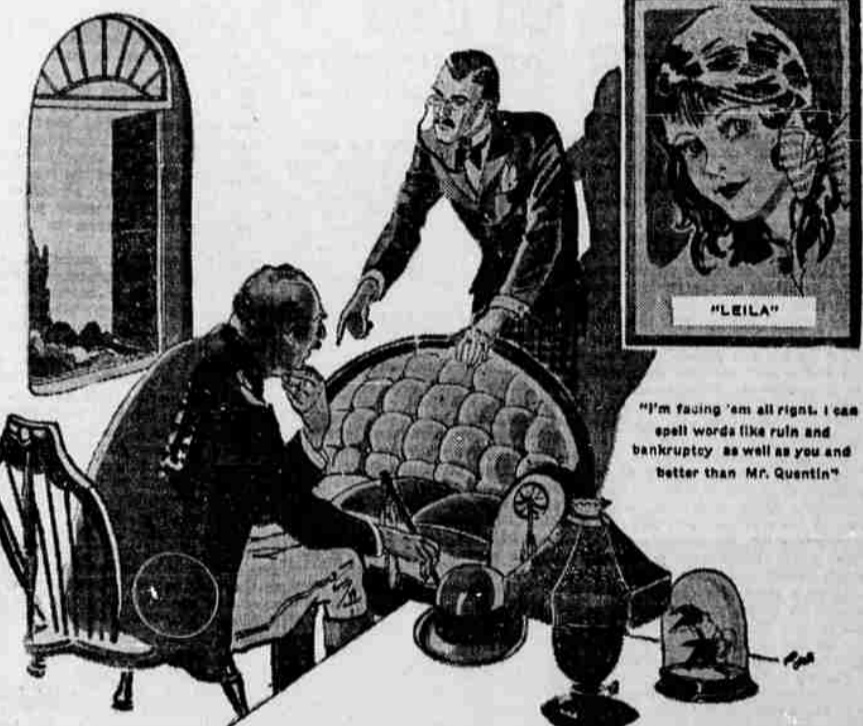
Buying Barbara by Julia Cleft-Addams Author of "YOU CANT MARRY"
