CULINARY CRAFT

When planning the holiday menus there is something intriguing about the thought of trying something "different" in stuffing the fowl. No matter how well we like the old stand-by stuffing and how sure we are of its success, we play with the thought of changing the flavor and texture with strange ingredients and, finally succumb to the inclination to experiment for better or worse.

Perhaps a little guidance along the paths of such excursions will help everyone concerned, even to the extent that the family will rejoice that new delicacies have been added to the ever-remembered pungent flavors of holiday dinners. So, we shall begin with plain stuffing and then vary as the possibilities may present themselves to our taste.

Plain Stuffing.
4 cups stale bread cubes
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon ginger
1 teaspoon poultry seasoning
1 tablespoon chopped parsley

Oyster Stuffing.
Use plain recipe, adding one pint of small oysters which have been carefully looked over for bits of shell. Do not use the fowl heart, liver or gizzard if using oysters.

Sausage Stuffing (Turkey)
2 quarts bread cubes
1 cup diced celery
2 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced parsley
1 lb. fresh sausage
1 egg
Salt
Pepper

Make patties of sausage and fry with the minced onion until browned on both sides, then combine with other ingredients. If bread is stale, dampen it with a little warm water beaten with the egg. Since the sausage is highly seasoned, no other seasoning need be added.

Orange Stuffing for Chicken.
2 oranges
14 walnuts
4 cooked apricots
4 cooked peaches
6 cooked prunes

Separate orange pulp from membrane. Drain all fruit well, then add to celery, bread and walnut meats. Beat egg lightly and stir into mixture and season lightly with a little salt and sugar.

Potato Stuffing (Goose).
Add 2 cups of hot, washed, Irish or sweet potatoes to plain dressing.

Chestnut Stuffing (Turkey)
1 quart chestnuts
1/4 cup butter, melted
1 teaspoon salt
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 pint bread cubes
1 pint mashed sweet potatoes
1 teaspoon chopped parsley
1 teaspoon minced onion
1 teaspoon minced celery
1 tablespoon minced onion
Shell and blanch the chestnuts, then cook in boiling, salted water about 10 minutes. Drain and slice. Combine with other ingredients, mix-

ing well and adding cream or stock if bread is especially dry (no more than 2 tablespoons). Wipe inside of turkey, flour lightly and fill with dressing, but do not pack tight or it will be heavy.

Prune Stuffing for Duck.
1 cup bread crumbs
Salt, pepper
2 tablespoons melted butter
1 cup chopped prunes
1 cup chopped apples
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
Soak prunes overnight, drain, stone

and chop. Add chopped apples, then remaining ingredients and mix well.

1 egg
(Heart, liver gizzard).
Soak bread in cold water, then squeeze dry. Heat drippings, chicken fat or bacon in frying pan (about 2 tablespoons of fat) and add the soaked bread and the minced onion. When fat is absorbed add the seasonings and the egg, slightly beaten. Wipe inside of fowl, flour lightly then fill with the stuffing but do not pack it tightly or it will be heavy or soggy. If you wish to include the heart, liver and gizzard, chop fine and par-boil before adding to the other ingredients.

Oyster Stuffing.
Use plain recipe, adding one pint of small oysters which have been carefully looked over for bits of shell. Do not use the fowl heart, liver or gizzard if using oysters.

Sausage Stuffing (Turkey)
2 quarts bread cubes
1 cup diced celery
2 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced parsley
1 lb. fresh sausage
1 egg
Salt
Pepper
