

TEXACOS DEFEAT SUPERVARSITY ON HUGHES BASKETS

With the spectacular little Loren Kitchen and Truxton Puteman running rings around their defense, Texaco's All-Stars were crowned all the way to defeat the University of Oregon super-varsity 37-29 on the high school floor last night. Only the deadly shooting of Od Hughes, who dropped in 17 points, kept the Oilers in the lead.

Foreman looped 14 points and Kitchen 10 to keep the Eugene team on the heels of the strong Texaco five. Kitchen, twice chosen on the all-state team is the cleverest ball hawk and offensive player seen here since the days of Al Melvin. At one time the score stood 13-6, with Hughes scoring all 13 points for Texaco by remarkable shooting.

Oregon looked vastly improved over their showing the previous night, when the high school defeated them 28-14, and are expected to give Burger's men a hard game at the senior high gym tonight. The admission price for the games tonight has been reduced, according to Principal C. C. Smith of the high school. The Tiger Cubs will play a preliminary with Jacksonville high school at 7:15.

In an early game last night the South Methodist quintet opened their season with a 19-8 victory over Eagle Point high, with Hadley Arthur marking up 10 points.

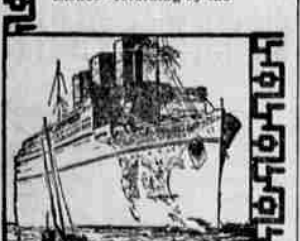

Many interesting phases of the law, the members learned, are still effective, and officials, Attorney Coddling stated, will continue to enforce these provisions until something different is devised to supplement them or strengthen what is left. "The coming legislature," it was pointed out at the meeting, "will be closely watched for any tendency on the part of legislators to safeguard the public against lawlessness and disorders resulting from repeal of protective measures."

The next regular meeting of the Civic League will be held January 17, at the "Y," and a large attendance is urged.
