SALEM, Ore., Jan. 9.—(AP)—While the joint ways and means committee of the legislature was in a 48-hour huddle on the most painful and effective manner of throwing state expenses for a million or so dollar loss, the Jackson county delegation, E. C. Kelly and E. B. Day, were provided on by J. C. Barnes in whipping the letters shelter tax bill into shape for introduction before the house.
