SANTA BARBARA, Jan. 10.—The legislators at Salem—like the legislators at Sacramento—and the legislators at Washington—for that matter—fail to realize the state of the public mind

Unless this IS realized the result of the special session in Salem promises to be the same as the result of the lame duck session in Washington—much ado about nothing—little if anything accomplished.

For under prevailing conditions, there is bound to be strong opposition to every measure to balance the budget—any budget—and any single measure. It makes no difference whether it is a sales tax, an economy measure, a beer tax, or an increase in the income tax.

What we are trying to get at is this: The big job at Salem, at Washington, at Sacramento—and everywhere else—is to balance the budget, to reduce expenditures to income.

This can't be done by any ONE tax, by any ONE reduction, by any ONE provision. It can only be done by many reductions, a radical readjustment all down the line.

The only way to get this done in our judgment, is to first settle on this comprehensive plan—the plan best fitted to balance the budget. Then fight for that plan and for that plan alone.

Such a program can be passed, but singly we doubt if any provision sufficiently radical to contribute materially toward a balancing of the budget can be.

We have an idea no one fully understands the medicinal value of sunshine. There is a very general belief that direct sunlight will kill germs.
