

### JACKSON COUNTY HEALTH ASSN. IN ANNUAL MEETING

Mrs. Mildred Carlton Made President—Other Officers Named—Large Amount of Relief Work Shown

At the annual meeting of the Jackson County Public Health association Thursday afternoon at the home of Mrs. Glenn Fabrick, the report of Mrs. Leonard Carpenter, chairman of the nominating committee was accepted and the following will carry on the work of the association for the year 1933:

Miss Mildred Carlton, president; Mrs. F. D. Wagner, Ashland, vice-president; Mrs. Lewis Ulrich, secretary; Mrs. J. C. E. Wellis, treasurer.

These, with Mrs. Leonard Carpenter, nurse chairman, Mrs. Alex Sparrow, finance; Mrs. Charles Taylor, supply; Mrs. R. E. Green, education; Mrs. I. E. Schuler, publicity, and Mrs. F. Corning Kenly, special activities, constitute the executive board.

Community chairman and advisory board members elected include Mrs. S. Provost, Ashland; Mrs. W. H. Higgins, Talent; Mrs. J. A. Gammill, Phoenix; Miss Helen Bullis, Medford; Mrs. Fred Pick, Jacksonville; Mrs. Everett Faber, Central Point; Mrs. Clarence Davies, Eagle Point; Mrs. F. Middlebush, Prospect; Mrs. Reed Carter, Rogue River; Miss Nellie Jacobs, Gold Hill; C. R. Bowman, county school superintendent; Dr. Harry Woods, Ashland; Dr. W. G. Bishop, Dr. Robert Stearns, Dr. I. C. Drummond, Dr. R. C. Mulholland and Dr. James Johnson.

The method employed in handling the unemployment relief work in the

county was explained by Hamilton Patton, who administers the county fund for the commissaries in Medford, Rogue River, Ashland and Medford. Mr. Patton reported 1200 families, with approximately 6000 persons as represented as receiving aid from this source.

The sixty-five women delegates represented the various health units in the county, the Parent-Teachers' associations and other agencies contributing to child welfare.

Miss Mildred Carlton, president, called for reports from officers and committee chairmen.

Mrs. Wellis, treasurer, reported receipts for the year 1932 as being \$5836.63, with a balance on hand of \$55.78.

Drastic cuts in income from various sources, withdrawal of community chest funds, and reduced amount of individual pledges and sale of Christmas seals make it necessary to provide for a budget of \$2221 for 1933.

Mrs. Alex Sparrow enumerated the items of the proposed budget showing cuts in nearly all items as compared with last year. Provision is made for nurses' salaries, transportation, dental clinic and other items.

Mrs. Kenly showed charts illustrating the growth of the county health work since the establishment of the dental clinics in 1928. Five dentists and 15 volunteer workers have assisted with 708 hours to their credit. Fifteen hundred and eighty children here have been treated at an expense of \$3698.17, with total fees of \$152 received. An invitation to visit the clinic was also extended. At present the clinic is operated every Tuesday and Friday afternoon from 1:30 to 4, with Dr. R. C. Mulholland and Dr. James Johnson in charge and Miss Harriet Sparrow assisting in the reception room.

Mrs. Carpenter, nurse chairman, told about the milk survey conducted in many states and quoted from a government pamphlet the deductions from the survey in which Oregon towns also participated.

Miss Helen Bullis, Medford chairman, introduced a number of representatives of local Parent-Teacher associations, whose reports showed that the undernourished school children are being clothed and fed and in

some cases provided with glasses and given medical care.

Mrs. F. D. Wagner reported similar activities for the Ashland district with a successful dental clinic held monthly.

Details of the Christmas seal sale were reported from the various districts of the county, following an incomplete report of the chairman, Mrs. R. E. Green, whose final report will be available February 15. The reports came from the Medford booth sales, Ashland, Central Point, Eagle Point, Talent, Phoenix, Gold Hill, Jacksonville, Rogue River, Wilmer.

Mrs. Gordon Voorhies read the Colony club report, showing co-operation in county child health work with more than \$200 donated for tonsil and ear operations and furnishing eyeglasses.

Tea was served by members of the Medford committee following the program.

### BLAST KILLS TWO IN RUBBER PLANT

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Feb. 3.—(AP)—Two men were killed and two others injured early today when an explosion followed by fire wrecked a one-story brick structure at the United States Rubber Co., in which coverings for golf balls were made.

Hundreds of windows were broken by flying debris in homes and factory blocks away.

The bodies of John J. Kilroe, 39,

and John O'Neill, 29, were recovered from the debris.

Company officials said there were five naphtha tanks in the building, each containing 250 gallons of naphtha. It is believed one exploded and ignited the others.

### FEW AWMILLS IN JANUARY REPORT

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 3.—(AP)—Only 25 of the 115 sawmills reporting to the Western Pine association were

operating during the week ending Jan. 28, the association said today. Production amounted to 10,418,000 feet for the week, or 7.8 per cent of capacity. New business was 19,842,000 feet, a trifle under the figure for the previous week, but 57 per cent below the three-year average for January. Shipments totaled 17,994,000 feet.

Current orders for the week were about 15 per cent of saw mill capacity.
