## HAM PRIZES ON BLIND BOGEY TO FEATURE OPENER

### Rogue Golf Course Announces Interesting Event As Spring On Horizon—Course in Fine Condition

Medford's golfers will have another chance to "take home the bacon" next Sunday in a valley tournament to formally open the year's golfing season. The course has been crowded during the past few afternoons, as the followers of the ball unnumbered under the year's first sunny days.

The tournament, open to both members and non-members, will be governed along the same lines that the turkey tournaments last fall were, with a blind bogey as feature of the day. Playing will start as soon Sunday morning as possible, Jack Hueston, professional at the club said, depending on whether or not the ground is frosty.

**Crowd Expected.**

Contestants will set their own handicaps for the bogey, and, if the tourneys last fall are any indication, the course will be crowded.

Fairways and greens are springing into life, and players are finding them in exceptionally fine shape for this early in the season. The greens are fast, and fairways smooth, and as the recent snows have flattened the weeds, the roughs aren't had to play in either.

Hueston said that most of Medford's real enthusiasts have been around at least once during the past few days, and the snappy weather has greatly enlivened their games.

**Start About 9:30.**

Weather permitting, the tourney Sunday will start at about 9:30 o'clock. Hueston explained that nothing short of another snowstorm would hold up the play.

Later in the season a "Scotch foursome" will be featured in a tournament. The "Scotch foursome" was popular 25 years ago, Hueston said, and is played by four players, with two men playing one ball. It was given the Scotch name, it is said, because it saved one ball, but arguments often arose as to which player's ball would be used.
