

DOG TEAM RACE TO BE FEATURE AT FT. KLAMATH

Famous Alaska Musher, Scotty Allan, Taking Outfit to Site Snow Carnival — Ski-Jumpers Practice

SKI CLUB HEADQUARTERS, Fort Klamath, Ore., Feb. 17.—(Spl.)—High-class talent will be represented in events next Sunday, opening Klamath's seventh annual winter sports carnival. This is especially true of ski jumping events of the afternoon when a group of star jumpers, recognized as among the best in the northwest, will participate.

Included among them are Bend Skyliners, veterans in the jumping art. Sunday visitors will see John Ring in action, as well as Cliff Eyster, Oe. Amoth and Bjorne Paulsen, whose names are well known in the skiing world. With snow conditions expected to be favorable, new jumping marks for Fort Klamath are expected to be made.

Stars to Jump. It is probable Arvid Iverson, also of Bend, and Dick Barnum of Fort Klamath will take part in jumps the same afternoon. Prize competition for club championships will be held on the following Sunday. Klamath Falls will be represented on both Sundays by the expected entry of Alf Ostmo, who has never failed to make a good showing in past carnivals.

Always a popular event, the three-mile race for ladies promises to be a hard fought battle, including Ingeborg Skjerve and Dorothy Lovgren of Bend as entrants. They are expected to offer strong competition for Doris Noah, Fort Klamath, and Winnie and Ida Britcoe of Malin, all of whom have taken part in ski events for several years past.

Scotty Allan, famed Alaskan musher, and his dogs, are expected to arrive late this week for racing events against one of the best dog teams available in the west. A special track is being prepared, offering Klamath county its first dog race on record.

Many Events Listed. In addition to other important races for high school boys and girls, grade school students and for the "Future Defenders of the Klamath," prize trophy for the 32-mile trek to Crater lake, club officials have prepared interesting novelty events, designed to keep every minute of the afternoon filled with entertainment.

Another new attraction will be the presence of the smallest yoke of oxen ever placed on exhibit on the coast. The animals, already well trained by their owner, P. C. Bishop, do not weigh 200 pounds each and will be hitched to a special sled. It is possible the miniature oxen will provide youngsters at the carnival with slight rides.

Carnival visitors next Sunday are reminded to come prepared for snow conditions. Club officials will provide visitors with bonfires and are making preparations to make them as comfortable as possible for afternoon events, beginning promptly at 1 o'clock.

Plans are also completed for the entertainment of the six Klamath Falls candidates for "Princess of the Snows," whose election is now being carried on countywide.

BURGER CAGERS FACING KLAMATH OUTFIT TONIGHT

Coach Darwin Burger's basketballers left this noon for Klamath county, where they will play Klamath Falls tonight and Chiloquin tomorrow night in the final Medford invasion of Klamath county this season.

Russell Brown, forward, did not make the trip, due to an attack of the flu and Coach Burger's desire to keep his men in the best possible condition for the game with Ashland next Thursday. Due to the size of the floor at Chiloquin, the second string will play there, Burger said, to prevent possible injury to players.

A better slant on the comparative strength of Medford and Ashland will be available after tonight's game, as Klamath Falls and Ashland split their recent series, with Ashland defeating Klamath Falls by a larger score than Medford did. Ashland's sudden spurt to power, under the able coaching of Don Palmer, has caused Coach Burger and the Medford fans no end of uneasiness. Tonight's game will either relieve, or increase, that feeling.

ROCKNE GREATEST SPORTS LEADER OF DECADE IS BALLOT

Fifty Experienced Sport Writers Polled by A. P.—41 Put Late Notre Dame Mentor at Head of List

NEW YORK, Feb. 17.—(AP)—By a margin so convincing that it leaves room for not the slightest doubt, the late Knute Kenneth Rockne stands out as the greatest sports leader over the past decade, in the opinion of those who have most closely scanned the whirl of events over that period.

Of the 50 experienced newspaper sports writers and editors who cast their votes at the request of the Associated Press, 41 put Rockne's name at the head of their list of those conspicuous for their coaching, organizing and leadership ability. His death nearly two years ago in an airplane accident has not dimmed the lustre of the genius of Notre Dame and his accomplishments in intercollegiate athletics.

Rickard, Mack Minority. Rockne's total points in this poll, on the basis of five for a first place, four for second place, and so on, nearly doubled the combined figures for his two nearest rivals, the late George L. (Tex) Rickard and Connie Mack.

Rockne, either first or second on every list, finished with 241 points. Rickard was next with 137 and Mack had 110. In the following order were these other illustrious figures:

Fourth, the late Miller Huggins; fifth, Howard Jones, football coach of the University of Southern California; sixth, John L. McGraw; seventh, the late Edward Kimbrell, Hall, for 20 years chairman of the national football rules committee; eighth, Edward O. Leader, rowing coach at Yale university; tied for ninth, Carroll (Ky) Ebright, rowing coach at the University of California, and Amos Alonzo Stagg, former athletic director at the University of Chicago.

Dempsey Aided Rickard. Aside from Rockne, the poll disclosed numerous wide differences of opinion. Rickard was omitted or put in a lower ranking by many who figured the success of his boxing extravaganza was due to fortuitous circumstances and a stellar attraction, Jack Dempsey, whose retirement was followed by the big decline in flat gate receipts. Others credited the one-time Goldfield gambler with a rare showmanship which made the most of his opportunities.

Connie Mack's dramatic baseball come-back with three straight pennant-winners, was considered more noteworthy as a managerial achievement than the six-time triumphs of the Yankees under the leadership of Huggins. McGraw received considerable support even though his career, as measured by successes, was past its peak at the opening of the last decade.

Football, with seven, and boxing, with six, contributed the most names to the poll.

REDDY INJURED IN CAGE PLAY

GONZAGA UNIVERSITY, Spokane, Wash., Feb. 17.—John Reddy, sophomore forward aspirant on the Gonzaga hoop squad, incurred a broken ankle in a practice tilt Monday night and will be lost to the Bulldog outfit for the remainder of the season. Reddy had but recently returned to Gonzaga after a term's absence, and his loss will be felt keenly down the home stretch of the season campaign, both because he had been showing good ball and because his injury marked the third suffered by a Bulldog basketballer this month.
