

BANKS AND WIFE ARE CHARGED IN PRESCOTT DEATH

editor of the Jacksonville Miner, on Saturday, March 4, when she took the law into her own hands to gain redress for an article published in Hall's paper. Piteh and VanWegen are alleged to have attempted to hold Hall, and Brown, her father, to have purchased the buggy whip.

Bonds in the buggy-whipping case were fixed at \$500 in the bank alder case at \$1000.

The first degree murder indictment against Banks and his wife were generally regarded as a foregone conclusion, and they were presented in court during a lull in the proceedings.

Proceedings in the indictment against Banks and his wife will be held as fast as legal procedure will permit. It has been indicated that the murder charge will be given the right of way over other criminal matters, and that the ballot theft indictment will come second.

Banks, in his Josephine county jail cell, was reported today as still defiant, and assuming the role of martyrdom. He is under close guard, and smokes cigarettes incessantly. Mrs. Banks was reported as irritable, but calm and confident.

Mrs. Martin and Banks Enjoy Cigaretts Solace Behind Cold Iron Bars

Her face wreathed in great clouds of smoke from her own cigarettes, Henrietta B. Martin, president of the Good Government congress, indicted by the grand jury for criminal syndicalism, remains decidedly cheerful in her cell in the Jackson county jail today, her jailors reported this afternoon.

She buys her own and smokes her own, they stated, and has received few callers. Although repeated requests of her followers to visit at her cell have been denied, Mrs. Martin continues gay. Her mother, Mrs. C. H. Brown has called frequently, but her husband, R. A. Martin, if at all, unidentified.

And while she in her gay pose smokes like a "miniature Vesuvius," L. A. Banks, honorary president of the congress, wreathes his face in a similar barrage in the Josephine county jail at Grants Pass, where he is the last member of the Jackson county group to be retained.

E. A. Fleming, charged with him, with murder in the first degree for the slaying of Constable Prescott, has been moved to Medford. T. L. Brecheen and G. W. Davis, indicted for the ballot theft, were brought to the local jail several days ago.

The expenses of prisoners incarcerated in Grants Pass will be borne by Jackson county and authorities are expected to transport Banks, also, to Jackson county's jail this week.

His chief requests, as reported in Grants Pass, are for more cigarettes. He smokes constantly, the jailors report, while outside the jail strict supervision of traffic and parking is maintained to prevent cars being left near the jail, which houses a killer.

Banks' attitude regarding the slaying of the officer remains calm and determined as he blows his smoke rings. He is by no means "down cast" by his imprisonment or the death of the Jackson county officer. Mrs. Banks, who sheltered him in the doorway, when the fatal bullet was fired from Banks' rifle, was also

JACKSON COUNTY WILL NAME FOUR FOR CONVENTION

SALEM, March 24.—(AP)—The constitutional convention in Oregon to vote upon the repeal of the 18th amendment to the federal constitution, known as the prohibition amendment, will be held in the house of representatives at Salem some time during the month of August.

This was definitely determined here today when it was learned the canvass of votes cast at the July 21 special election would be completed before August 1, and that the act states the governor shall call the convention within 30 days after the canvass of the votes.

A total of 116 delegates will be elected at the special election, all candidates to announce their preference on the ballot. To date, only two candidates for delegates have filed, while a third was considering filing. The two both wet, already filed are Howard Waddell of Roseburg and Hugh H. Earle of Eugene.

Of the 116 delegates to be named to the state constitutional convention, based upon population, Jackson county would elect four.

One o'clock Luncheon.
Green Sparkle
Pear Salad
Crab Noodle Ring
Spinach Timbales
Hot Biscuits With Orange Marmalade
Peppermint Candy Ice Cream

Green Sparkle.
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1/2 cup orange juice
1/2 cup ginger ale
Mix lemon and orange juices. When ready to serve, add ice cubes and ginger ale. (Pour on side of glass to preserve sparkle.)

PEAR SALAD.
Color pear halves with green coloring. Fill centers with a ball of yellow cheese mixed with green olives. Serve on lettuce leaf with a little cooked dressing thinned with cream.

Crab Noodle Ring.
1 1/2 cup cooked noodles
1 tablespoon butter
2 tablespoons flour
3/4 cup milk
2 eggs
1 tablespoon chopped green pepper
1 tablespoon chopped pimiento
1 tablespoon chopped parsley
Salt.
Drain the cooked noodles and place in a buttered ring mold. Make a sauce by melting butter, add flour and salt then the beaten eggs with milk and chopped greens. Pour over the noodles and bake at 325 degrees or in hot water until mixture is set (about 1 1/2 hrs.) Fill the unmolded ring with creamed crab and garnish the whole with lettuce, stuffed prunes and celery curls.

Spinach Timbales.
2 1/2 cup canned spinach
2 tablespoons butter
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 eggs
2 teaspoons lemon juice
F. g. pepper
1/2 cup chopped walnuts.
Drain spinach and chop fine. Heat, add butter and seasonings, then add the slightly beaten eggs and put into buttered custard cups. Bake at 325 for 30 minutes.

Peppermint Ice Cream.
12 small sticks peppermint candy
1 cup milk
1 pint whipping cream
F. G. salt.
Crush the candy and dissolve in the milk. Chill in refrigerator, then add the pinch of salt and fold in the whipped cream. Pour into freezing pan and freeze without stirring.

Angel Loaf Cake.
Bake angel cake mixture in loaf pan. Cut in squares after icing with thick cooked icing. (Seven minute icing very good.)

Golf has many mental hazards, but none is more annoying to the average golfer than the sight of his ball landing in a sand trap. And yet, getting out of a trap need not be the difficult matter that many players make it.

If you consider the "explosion" shot as just one more part of the game, you can overcome your fear of it quite readily. Practice this shot just as thoroughly as you do your drive. Take a number of balls into the sand—place them at every possible angle—bury them, step on them—and practice getting them out with your niblick until you have mastered this stroke.

The bunkers and sand traps make golf the fascinating, interesting game it is, and no matter how good or bad his game may be, I doubt if any golfer has ever enjoyed playing on an easy, simple course.
