Pointers On Cookery, The Home, Child Care

USE FULL OVEN CAPACITY: IT'S TIP TO SAVE FUEL

Fuel is costly, and control of it should be exercised in every household. The filled oven requires very little more fuel than the one partly filled.

Use of the oven to its capacity is generally advisable. When having a baked dinner, such as meat loaf, scalloped potatoes and baked squash, cook some foods to be served later on. These can be pudding, a loaf of date or nut bread, some fruit sauce, a baked pudding or gingerbread.

When meat is to be broiled plan the menu so as to have other foods baking while the broiling is going on.



Fats Concentrated Fuel. WASHINGTON—(AP)—Fats are the most concentrated body fuels, says the Bureau of Home Economics. They contain more energy than sweets and starches. Butter and cod-liver oil are good sources of vitamins. For this reason the child needs butter every day and cod-liver oil at least during the winter.

Safe Play Space. The toddler needs space both indoors and out where he may play freely without the possibility of getting into trouble. A gate can be let into the doorway of his nursery, so that he can see mother in the next room, talk with her and not feel himself too much alone.

Are You Wasting Foods? There are many little ways of getting all the valuable parts of food when it is being cooked, careful attention to which will, in time, cut grocery and meat bills.

Bacon fat, if properly cooked, is good to use for browning foods, for seasoning and for adding flavor to soups and stews. When cooking bacon, pour off the fat as soon as it melts. With every pound of bacon you will find nearly a cup of fat.

Self-Help Fastenings. Big buttons are much easier for the small child to manage than little ones. For this reason they should

be used exclusively on his dresses and underclothing. These should open in front or at the sides.

MODERNIZED CLOSETS EASE TASKS OF HOUSEKEEPER

A bedroom closet can be made a most attractive and useful wardrobe by fitting it with various sizes of trays, boxes and accessory holders. Modernization of the closets throughout the house will go far in promoting efficient housekeeping.

The installation of electric lights and the making of windows will give added light, which greatly improves the closet.

In closets used for holding outdoor garments bars can be placed to hold the coats, racks for the hats and built in holders for the umbrellas.

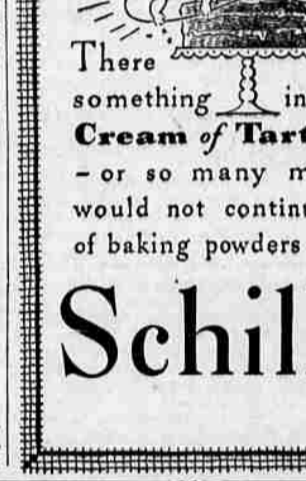
NATURE PICTURES ON HIGH SCHOOL SCREEN ARE FREE SATURDAY
