

ASHLAND NORMAL PLANS BIG SPORT LIST FOR SPRING

Tennis to Take Main Spot in Athletic Activity—Baseball, Horseshoes, Track Competition Also Planned

ASHLAND, April 6.—(Sp.)—With baseball as the highlight, the spring sports schedule for Ashland Normal school students was outlined by Coach Howard Hobson yesterday, at a meeting in the school auditorium.

Besides baseball, students wishing to participate in some form of athletics will have plenty of chance to do so as Hobson has arranged a full program of activities for the spring quarter. Included in this program will be a tennis tournament, a horseshoe tournament, a cross-country and an inter-class track and field meet, inter-class volleyball and spring baseball.

Tennis interests among the students were the focus of the meeting. The following are the coaches: Cadoux, Philip; Johnson, and Siden. Hobson, in a few days, will appoint a committee to work with him on getting the tournament started.

The horseshoe pitching tournament is expected to have in the neighborhood of 20 entries. Miss "Lifty" Mills, winner of last year's championship, has been practicing daily.

As for spring football, Hobson states that no amount of work would be attempted. "We will work mainly on fundamentals," he said.

Due to financial conditions and the fact that the school is situated in a rural area, baseball which might be played, will not enjoy a very prepossessing schedule of games.

FRISBIE FLATTENS BELCASTRO TWICE IN ROUGH GRAPPLE

Fireman Ray Frisbie slapped Pete Belcastro to the mat and jumped on him for the deciding fall at their govy grapple at the Armory last night, the maneuver coming when the Sacramento Italian turned his back on the local man, to argue with Les Weisa, referee. The sudden ending of the match proved unpopular with fans who had been wrought to high pitch by the rough and bloody tussle.

In the 45-minute preliminary, Roland Warren, Klamath Copco employee, pinned Fireman Coy of Weed, Cal., in straight falls, the second upset coming as a result of an airplane spin. Warren, although outweighed, was in better condition than the lad from California and was master of the situation almost from the start.

Belcastro lived up to his pre-match boast that he would rough Frisbie up, starting the main event with a bagful of tricks calculated to make his opponent open up for a throwing job. Frisbie, however, stood the gauntlet, and after being shored out of the ring a couple of times took the offensive and dashed up a bit of dirt on his own account. The first fall went to Belcastro in eight minutes, the second to Frisbie in nine minutes and the third required about ten minutes. Frisbie resorted to his stunning flying leg scissors to pin the Italian for the second fall. This hold, backed by the fireman's 210 pounds, proved devastating to most opponents and it has been a matter of wonder why Ray does not use it more often.

A free-for-all was threatened last night following the final fall, when one of Belcastro's cohorts leaped into the ring to wrangle with Referee Weisa. Weisa had called upon the men to break after they had rolled partially under the ropes on the east side of the ring. Belcastro objected, after rising to his feet, claiming he had a throwing hold on the local man. While the Italian expostulated

ROUGHHOUSE WRESTLING WILL BE TABOO IN SALEM

SALEM, April 6.—(AP)—Wrestling in Salem must be "toned down and cleaned up," or legal steps will be taken to have it banned. That ultimatum was handed down by members of the Salem boxing and wrestling commission late yesterday by District Attorney Trindle, who expostulated himself as thoroughly displeased with the rough tactics used in the Robin Reed-Bulldog Jackson match here Tuesday night.

Trindle cited the Jackson-Reed match as typical of the "illegal" matches which have been held. He decried the use of a faucet handle concealed in tape on the hand of one wrestler, and various forms of slugging, biting and chair wielding. A near-riot occurred Tuesday night when several chairs were thrown into the ring by spectators and Reed was urged by spectators to use them on "Bulldog" Jackson. Police were called upon at the end of the match to calm the crowd.

Conferees all admitted that Jackson and Reed in private life were good friends, staying at the same quarters, eating together and apparently being comrades except in the ring.

ROOSEVELT CUTS FARM TOOL DUTY

WASHINGTON, April 6.—(AP)—The tariff commission today announced that President Roosevelt had issued his first proclamation under authority of the flexible tariff law, calling for a decrease in duties on certain agricultural hand tools.

Interest was attached to the proclamation because of the prospect of a change in tariff policy with the transfer of the administration from Republicans to Democrats hands.

In today's proclamation, the president ordered a decrease in the duty on hay forks and 4-lined fertilizer forks from 8 cents each and 45 percent ad valorem to 4 cents each and 22 1/2 percent ad valorem, the maximum decrease possible under the flexible law.

On other agricultural forks, hoes and rakes, he ordered a decrease from 30 percent ad valorem to 15 percent ad valorem. The changes become effective May 3.
