DEATH IN SMASHUP FOR CAREY, AUTO SPEED KING

LOS ANGELES, April 17.—(AP)—Death laid a halting hand on Bob Carey, king of the American speedway, as he roared away here yesterday in conquest of another national championship.

The 28-year-old driver, who time upon time had flung aside caution to race to victory on dirt tracks throughout the country, lost control of his new \$10,000 machine at a turn at the Ascot speedway. It crashed through the guard rail, hurtled 30 feet into the air and came down rolling end over end, with Carey trapped at the wheel.

Mechanics and other drivers pried him free of the wreckage, but he died as he was being removed to a hospital. Track officials said the foot throttle of his car had jammed and resisted his frantic efforts to free it.

Carey was driving 90 miles an hour in the time trial for the 62 1/2-mile feature event. The daring Anderson, Ind., driver had been racing for almost ten years. He made his first successful bid for fame at the 300-mile Indianapolis speedway classic last Memorial day.

He placed fourth in this race, after surviving a series of mishaps which dodged the racers, and victories in other races gave him the 1932 national A. A. A. championship. Carey held every dirt track record from one to one hundred miles.
