WASHINGTON, April 20. (AP)—A resolution authorizing the president to investigate and adjust construction, operation and maintenance charges on western irrigation projects was introduced today by Senator McNary (R., Ore.), and referred to the irrigation committee.

It would permit credits on such charges where lands have been damaged or made unproductive and credits would be applied to rentals of any old lands retained and new lands patented for irrigation settlers.
