

TRADE DELEGATES OF SOVIET CALLED IN FROM BRITAIN

Action Follows Conviction of Five British Engineers and Embargo Against Importations From Russia

MOSCOW, April 21.—(AP)—As the clouds of economic war darkened the horizon, Zvezda, official soviet organ, lashed out today at "British imperialists."

It accused them of attempting to use the recent sabotage trial of British engineers to promote an empire trade program laid down at the imperial conference at Ottawa last year. Meanwhile a plea for "mercy" for two engineers sentenced to prison was being considered by the soviet central executive committee. Defense counsel had asked that the prison terms imposed on L. O. Thornton and William L. MacDonald, convicted of spying and wrecking, be commuted to exile for life.

LONDON, April 21.—(AP)—The chiefs of the soviet Russian trade delegation to London were recalled to Moscow today "for consultation" and will start for home next Monday.

This action follows the conviction of five British engineers tried in Moscow on sabotage charges, and the imposition of an 80 per cent embargo against Russian importations into England, a measure resorted to by the government in protest against the sabotage case.

Asked if there was any question of the delegation not returning to London, a soviet official said:

"All I can say at present is that the delegation is going home to make a report—a not unusual thing from time to time."

British Envoy Called Home

While the negotiations between London and Moscow over the sabotage case were going on the British government called home its Russian ambassador for personal discussions concerning it, and he has not since returned.

The British government is maintaining its firm policy in regard to the embargo pending a final soviet decision as to whether the prison sentences of L. O. Thornton and William L. MacDonald, two of the convicted engineers, are to be commuted.

The foreign office, without direct information from Moscow but press reports indicated commutation was likely.

In the highest quarters it was learned that if the sentences are commuted Britain will take steps to insure the continuation of Anglo-Russian trade either by resending the embargo proclamation or by a licensing system.

Britain To Hold Firm

It was officially stated that the embargo was not proclaimed in the face of a warning from Moscow that such action would make it more difficult for the soviet government to commute the sentences of the engineers.

The present situation is that Britain will continue the firmest possible steps to protect British subjects in Russia and at the same time will take advantage of any opportunity to maintain trade relations.

The national union congress, representing the trades union congress, the labor party and the parliamentary labor party, is understood to have decided at a private meeting today to protest strongly to the British government against the embargo.

Hamaging Effect Claimed

This protest, it was reported, is based on the theory that the embargo would have a most damaging effect on British industry and on the employment situation, and also on the contention that it is a violation of the Kellogg peace pact.

The council also sent a telegram to the soviet ambassador, I. M. Maisky, asking for the release of the British prisoners on the ground of international friendship.

The Russians who have been summoned home are Ozeraky, head of the trade delegation, and his two assistants, Kharginoff and Essonov.

ENGINEER BURNED BY FLAMING OIL

POPULAR BLUFF, Mo., April 21.—(AP)—Sticking to his throttle in the face of gasoline flames, Engineer Charles Leadbetter brought the St. Louis-bound "Twan," a Missouri Pacific train, to a stop today and then fell unconscious, critically burned. The passengers were unharmed.

The locomotive struck an oil truck near Moark, Mo., killing the driver and throwing gasoline over the speeding locomotive. Fireman E. E. Hurt was killed when he leaped from the cab. The engineer brought the train to a stop about three quarters of a mile from the scene of the crash.

MOTOR LICENSE FUND TURNED IN

SALEM, April 21.—(AP)—Total funds from the motor vehicle licenses for the first quarter of 1933, which is the third quarter of the license year, turned over to the state treasurer were \$186,739. Secretary of State Hal E. Hose announced today.

Of this money the state highway commission received \$82,000, the counties \$41,000 and \$63,739 went for administrative expense.

During the same interval fees collected from motor transportation licenses totaled \$30,082, of which \$22,561 went to the highway commission and \$7,520 apportioned among the counties.
