

"Old Ironsides" Passes the Gate



Through the famous Golden Gate on March 24 came the historic Frigate Constitution, to be welcomed at San Francisco by thousands of school children and other visitors. This remarkable picture, taken from the Associated Oil company plane, shows "Oil Ironsides" just off the trestie that is stretching out from Old Fort Point for the building of the Golden Gate bridge. The minuteness of the gallant frigate that came victorious through about 55 engagements at the height of her career, is emphasized by comparison with the Associated Tanker Frank H. Buck, 425 feet in length, outbound from San Francisco bay. The Constitution will continue up the coast in the near future to make stops at all principal harbors.
