

WINDOW DISPLAY GIVES ARGUMENT IN HEALTH DRIVE

"Protect Your Home" is the slogan which stands out above all others in the clever window display, arranged by the Chamber of Commerce this week, announcing the membership drive of the Jackson County Public Health association. The home, in the display, as in life, is the center of interest, and the scene, developed by Tom Swann for the health association, stresses the need to guard the home against the army of disease, and the splendid effort put forth by the health association to accomplish this need.

In front of the attractive white house stand doctor, dentist and nurses, whose services here have been made possible by the Jackson County Health association. Pressing toward them, unable to break through their defenses, is the army of diseases, and all are present in the clever figures created by Mr. Swann. Smallpox, measles, diphtheria, tuberculosis and rickets offer foreboding faces to the public, and rickets a body twisted as the most emphatic stories in hygiene would imply. Great bugs crawling at the feet of the diseases add to the horrors of the army of germs and epidemics.

In front stand two "good citizens," who are paying 50 cents for memberships in the health association to aid the war against diseases, threatening to enter homes of rich and poor.

A poster announces that 450 children, who would otherwise have received no treatment, were examined by the county doctor last year. Another reveals that 425 children were treated by dentists through the health association.

The complete display sounds an appeal for membership, which will undoubtedly bring forth a splendid response from the public.

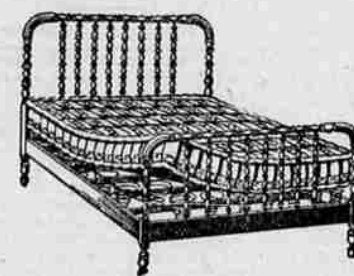

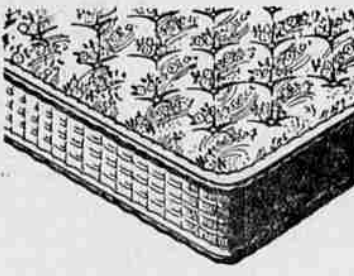
