

**LIBRARY PARTICIPATES
IN HEALTH WEEK WITH
OFFER OF GOOD BOOKS**

Observing health week and the membership drive being carried on by the Jackson County Health Association, the city library has on display with appropriate poster to announce them a number of books on health.

The splendid assortment includes books advising the expectant mother, messages on care of the new baby, care and feeding of the growing child, adolescent youth, psychology of youth, nerves and diets.

All citizens of the valley are invited to take advantage of this service extended by the library at all times and procure whatever information is desired in caring for health problems.

A list of food habits best for growth was released yesterday by the health association for the child. It reads:

Fast three meals daily; eat nothing between meals unless the physician says so. These daily meals should include:

Milk: 2 to 4 cups to drink, and in cooked foods.
Bread or Cereal — One or both at every meal.

Vegetables and Fruit—Potatoes and at least two other vegetables and fruit (citrus fruit and tomatoes of ten.)

Eggs—Three or four weekly.
Fat—Two to four tablespoonfuls of such fat as butter, olive oil, cream and fat meats.

Sweets—In cooked foods only. No sweets between meals.

Other Foods—Either meat, fish, dried beans, dried peas or lentils for older children.

Cod-liver Oil—Two to three teaspoonfuls.
Food Alone Cannot Protect Health. Sleep 9 to 11 hours each night, with windows open.

Play two or more hours in the fresh air daily, with at least one-half hour in the sun when it shines.

Drink water freely between meals. Attend to elimination regularly.

**PRESCOTT'S PICTURE
AND TRAGEDY STORY
PUBLISHED BY 'LION'**

In the May issue of "The Lion," official publication of the service club, a photo of Constable George J. Prescott, and a short article appear telling of the high regard in which the officer who was shot down by L. A. Banks, was held. His name was also listed in the memorial column.

"Lions Who Have Gone Before," was the article stated: "Death, sudden and violent, came some days ago to George J. Prescott, one of the best loved and most highly regarded Lions of Medford, Oregon. Lion Prescott was a constable, and while in line of duty, serving a warrant issued by a court of law, he was shot dead without warning by the man for whom the warrant had been taken out.

"A long editorial tribute in the local newspaper closes with this paragraph: 'The best tribute we can pay to George Prescott is that he died in the line of duty—died carrying out the mandates of the law he had sworn before his God to uphold.'"

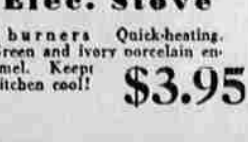

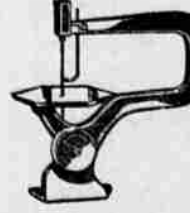

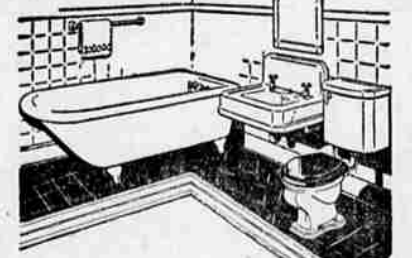
