

### FEHL FILES SUIT FOR DAMAGES ON MACHINERY MOVE

Charging that part of the machinery and equipment moved last week from the Pacific Record Herald building on West Sixth street by Niedermeyer, Inc., on a replevin suit filed in circuit court did not belong to Niedermeyer, and that the Fehls had been damaged by an alleged unlawful removal of the property, Earl H. Fehl and Electa Fehl filed an answer and counter suit in circuit court yesterday asking for \$1150 damages and \$100 attorney's fees.

Fehl charged that he had been damaged \$500 by the removal, that he had expended \$200 on putting the equipment in order, and that other equipment purchased, including rolls of paper belonging to Art LaDieu, amounting to \$200 was unlawfully removed.

Articles removed, which Fehl claims belonged to him personally or to others, were listed as an addressograph, typewriter desk, leather cover, table, power saw, Boston staples and the paper.

Friday Fehl filed suit in justice court for the collection of \$250 rental allegedly due Electa Fehl from Niedermeyer, for rental on storage of the machinery in the Fehl building from the time the building was purchased under a mortgage sale, until Fehl started to print his paper there.

In the answer filed yesterday, Fehl denied that any contract or agreement for a weekly rental on the machinery had been agreed upon by himself and Niedermeyer, Inc., but that he had offered to purchase the machinery. Niedermeyer claimed, in the replevin suit, that a rental of \$20 a week had been the agreement between Fehl and the Niedermeyers.

### Twins Tied for Honor as Medford Hi Salutatorian

An announcement of interest to Medford residents and many friends throughout the state, and especially to students of "twin psychology," has just been made by C. Glenn Smith, principal of Medford high school. The Perry Twins, Frances and Elizabeth, who won the championship of Oregon in the final contest of the state high school debate league at Corvallis Saturday, have now been announced as tying for the honor of salutatorian of the graduating class at Medford high school.

This selection of salutatorian is independent of achievements in extracurricular activities, of which the Perry Twins have many. It is based upon the actual scholastic record of students during the last half of their junior year and the first half of the senior year.

"Occasionally we have had students tie for this citation, based on their marks for two semesters," said Principal Smith, "but by checking back for a semester or two farther, it has always been possible to pick the winner. On the contrary, in this instance we could not discover a lot of difference in the standing of these sisters, even by scanning their records for four years. Therefore, we had no alternative other than to grant the honor to both."

The twins will collaborate in writing the salutatorian speech, and either draw lots to determine which shall deliver it, or possibly both will speak, making a unique dialogue effect of the delivery.

Psychologists observing the development of true or identical twins have been interested in learning from the parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. H. Perry, of Rogue River, that their daughters have been exactly alike in every way from babyhood—physically, mentally and in all their talents and interests. This has continued in every stage of their development during their 16 years. If one of the twins acquired seven pounds during a certain month of a certain year, the other girl gained exactly the same weight in the same period. If one twin took a notion to grow three-quarters of an inch in any specified period, her sister grew up accordingly. At no stage in their lives have they varied over a pound in weight or one-quarter of an inch in height.

Similarly the Perry Twins like the same things and do them together. They excel in art work and if a poster must be turned out in a hurry, they work together on it at the same time, and later no one can ascertain where one left off and the other started. Also they collaborate on their four-natal activities, including their column "Perry Tales" in the high school paper, which has brought numerous favorable comments even from outside readers regarding its subtle humor of adult quality.

Scholastically, the twins have kept up an even pace, each achieving a straight "A" record throughout the four years at high school. Their teachers have expressed surprise at their ability to carry on this perfect record, considering the time they devote to extra-curricular activities.

### OREGON BREWERY PROJECT MAKING RAPID PROGRESS

PORTLAND, Ore., May 13.—(Spl.)—C. H. Eismann, production manager of the Oregon Breweries and Hop Farms, Affiliated, released an announcement here today that his organization would, on May 15, increase all salaries from 10 to 20 per cent, stating that in keeping with President Roosevelt's request they were in a position to do this because of the

recent rise in hop prices, due to the demand of brewers.

The Oregon Breweries and Hop Farms, Affiliated, own 200 acres of hop lands near Grants Pass and have options on 500 acres more in Jackson and Josephine counties. The company recently, through its president, James E. Edmlston, announced a \$350,000 brewery project in Portland.

Edmlston has been most fortunate in surrounding himself with a personnel of well-known business and professional men. Especially is he deemed fortunate, according to Portland business men, in obtaining the services of Frederick Glatz, Richard Ulrich and Rudie Wilhelm.

Glatz will have charge of the brewing of the beer. His name is favorably known throughout the brewing world as one of its leading brewmasters.

Ulrich, engineer and millwright, has won distinction for his many successful installations of new breweries and malt houses through the United States and Canada. Rudie Wilhelm is a name that is known wherever golf is played. He is assigned to the transportation and traffic end of the new enterprise.

Eismann stated here that the hop farms would increase their employment by 35 per cent within the next few weeks. Glatz and Ulrich are now in the east buying the machinery for the new project.

Edmlston, the president of the company, is well known in the Rogue River valley, having lived in Medford for over 15 years. As president of the Medford Tennis club, Klamath Falls, Ashland and Grants Pass will remember his ability to direct a successful organization.
