

LAND GRANT TAX CLAIM FORMALLY FILED BY COUNTY

Jackson county, through the assessor, has filed with the treasury department at Washington, D. C., its Oregon-California land grant tax claim for \$69,218.84, for the 1932 tax.

The claim with certified copies of special tax and other tax levies was forwarded today to the federal authorities. The claim is usually paid in the fall.

The Oregon-California tax claim for 1931 was \$60,242.17. The approximate \$9,000.00 increase this year, is due to more special school district levies, and to an increase in state and county levies.

The claim was filed a couple of months earlier than usual, according to Assessor J. B. Coleman, in pursuance to a telegram from Congressman James W. Mott, urging an early filing.

Several of the upstate counties, it was said, were depending on the O-C money in order to make their state tax payments, and signified their intention of not paying it until the O-C money was received.

Press and other reports from Washington, D. C., have indicated that the O-C payments would be prorated among the 18 Oregon counties coming under provisions, owing to a shortage of federal funds.

BABY'S DEATH HOLDS WARNIN GON SPREAD OF WHOOPING COUGH

As tragic proof of the seriousness of an attack of whooping cough to little children and infants, the baby son of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Belchers of Glendale lies dead here today. All efforts of physicians to save the little life when pneumonia followed whooping cough, proved fatal.

Realizing that the baby was very ill, the Belchers brought him to Medford early this week. A physician was summoned and the case was diagnosed as pneumonia. Whooping cough was brought into the family by an older girl, who recovered satisfactorily, but when the two-month-old baby contracted the epidemic, complications brought pneumonia.

This frequently happens, physicians stated today in criticizing severely any people who permit their children to carry the epidemic into other families, failing to realize that there may be infant brothers or sisters at home who will be unable to withstand the disease.

Although whooping cough is much more serious its attack upon very young children, it is never an epidemic to be accepted lightly, physicians stated, further describing the case. Serious complications often result and every precaution should be taken to prevent any children, especially those under school age, from contacting anyone with whooping cough.

NELSON'S HEARING NEXT WEDNESDAY

Hearing of the case of W. G. Nelson, Portland, a truckman and foreman on state highway construction work in this section, charged with failure to halt and give aid, and report an auto accident, was continued this morning by Justice of the Peace William R. Coleman, until next Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock.

Continuation of the case was requested by Attorneys Roberts and McAllister, for Nelson, and acquiesced in by the district attorney's office.

Nelson was arrested last Tuesday night by state police, following an auto accident on the Central Point cutoff road, wherein S. W. Balise, flugman, was run down and sustained a broken pelvic bone and other severe injuries.

Nelson, the authorities say, was arrested an hour after the crash, and allege that a fender and light had been removed from his auto.

Canary Whistles Yankee Doodle

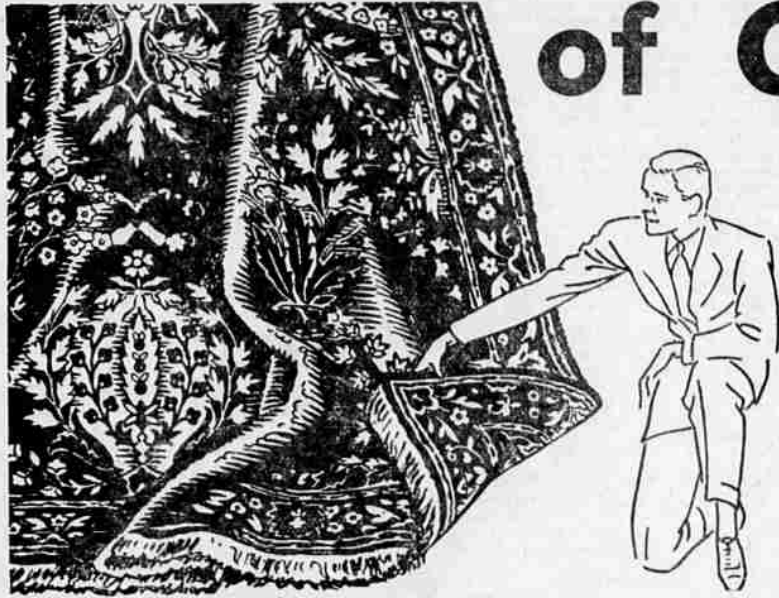
AMITY, May 26.—(P)—What tune does your canary bird whistle?

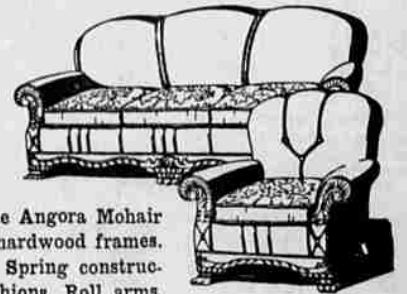

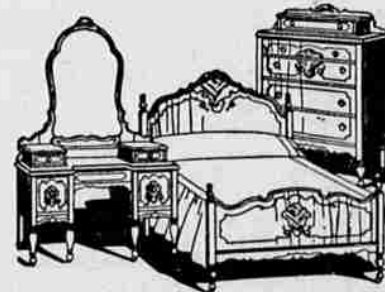
