The examination papers were mailed to the state chairman, and as a result, Wildon Colbaugh received a cash prize representing honorable mention in the state finale.

A total of 1336 manuscripts were submitted this year, and the national winner, who was awarded with a trip to Europe, was Sidney H. Levy of Buffalo, N. Y.
Wildon Colbaugh, local senior, who placed high in the competitive exams, has been president of the Associated Boys during the ensuing year, as well as a member of the band, orchestra, and debating team. This is the second year that the local high school has participated in the competition. Preparations and administrations of the examination were handled by Miss Josephine Kirtley, head of the history department in the local senior high school.
