

### WHITE, MONROE FIGHT DRAW IN ARMORY ARENA

In a slam-bang battle which at times became a three-cornered affair with Referee Lee Weiss taking a hand Herb White, Medford, and Frankie Monroe, Klamath Falls, chalked up another draw last night in their long standing feud. The six-round fight, carded as the main event in Mack Lillard's weekly bouts at the armory was the third meeting of the clever lightweights, whose score now stands at two draws, and one decision for Monroe.

The stocky Spider Fields, showing vastly improved form, gave Frankie Nelson, elongated Portland puncher, a terrific beating in the six round semi-final last night to win a clean-cut decision. Nelson's experience was all that enabled him to weather the barrage of blows launched by the local boy.

Chief Grey Eagle, Elliquin Indian, had little difficulty in stopping Del Jones, Klamath Falls, in the third round of their scheduled four-rounder. Jones' seconds heaved in the towel to save the white boy who had been on the floor more than on his feet after the first few minutes of the set-to. Jones took a nice count five times and seemingly had little desire to stand up and swap punches with the muscular little redskin.

Boy Harris, Phoenix, technicalized Lew Polin, Klamath Falls, in the second frame of their curtain-raising four-rounder. Polin was willing, but after kissing the canvas twice in the first, his handlers tossed in the towel as the second round got under way with Polin plainly in no condition to continue.

Monroe substituted last night for Butch Johnson of Onalaska, the latter having been kicked by a horse Sunday and badly injured.

According to announcement last night Lillard's next show will feature exponents of the grunt and grimace game with two good matches planned.

After the two had wrestled 25 minutes for the third fall, they both got the idea at the same time for a flying tackle, and met head-on. Both crashed to the mat, but Cheung lit on top and was awarded the fall.
