By FRANK JENKINS CONGRESS has passed and the President has signed a law for the rehabilitation of agriculture. It is known as the farm relief act.

With the determination to bring prosperity to industry, it too goes farther than any similar law ever before in this country, discarding the old theory that competition is the life of trade and giving to industry, under government supervision, permission to ELIMINATE destructive and vicious competition.

AGRICULTURE has been taken care of by law. Industry is to be made prosperous, if it can be done by legislation.

FOR thousands of years, business was run in such a way as to provide a FEW PEOPLE with the bulk of the benefits.

SO, if we are going to pass a law to make agriculture prosperous, or we are going to pass a law to make industry prosperous, let us have the good sense to go on and take the other necessary and logical step and pass a law to make labor prosperous.
