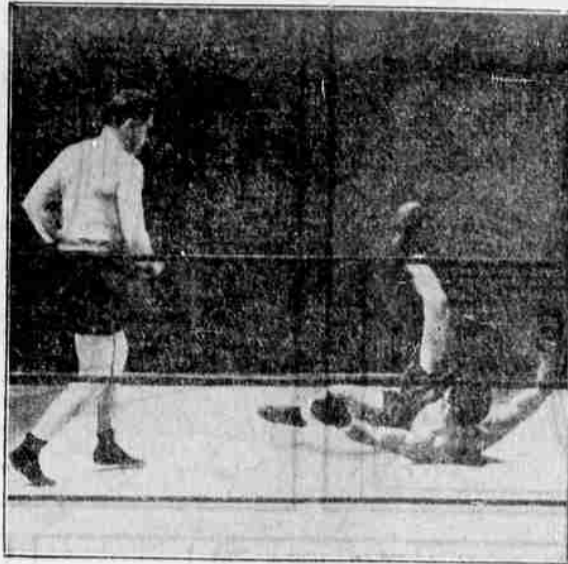


**WISCONSIN FARMERS MASS AT CAPITOL AS STRIKE ENDS**



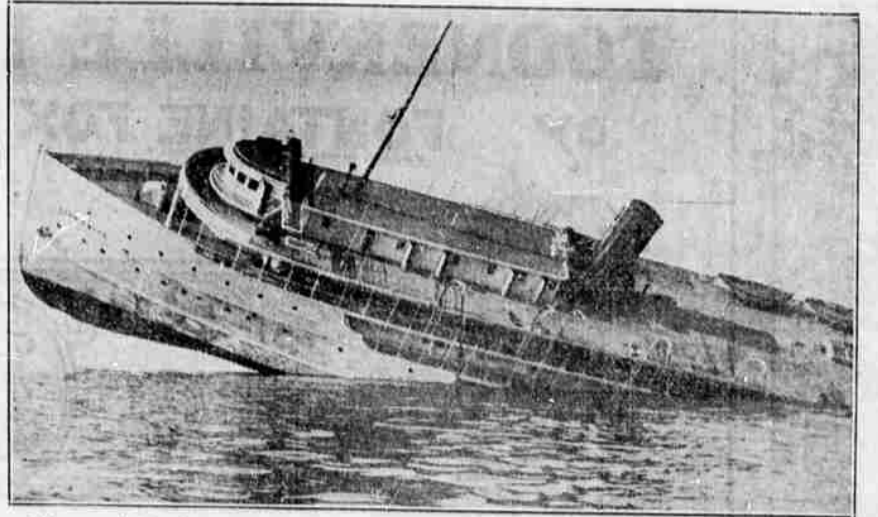

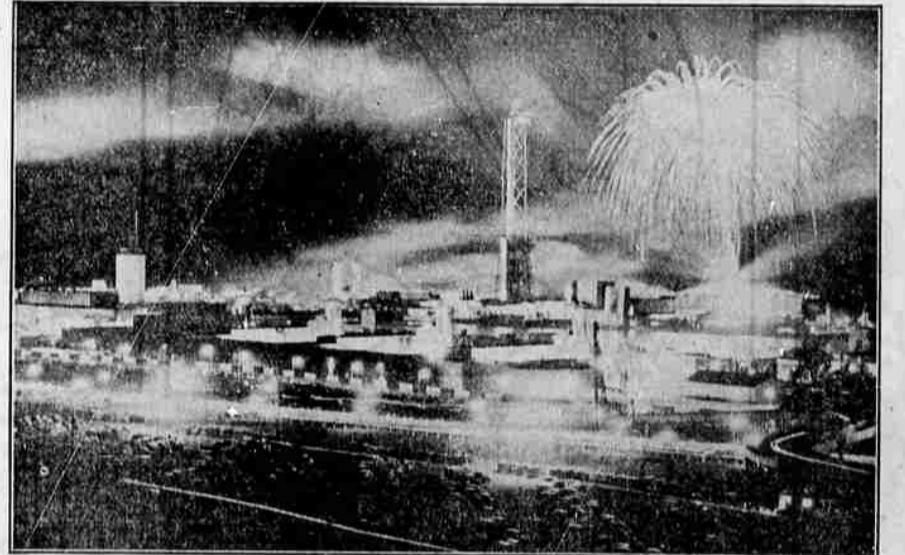

**SHERWOOD ORDERED TO COURT**



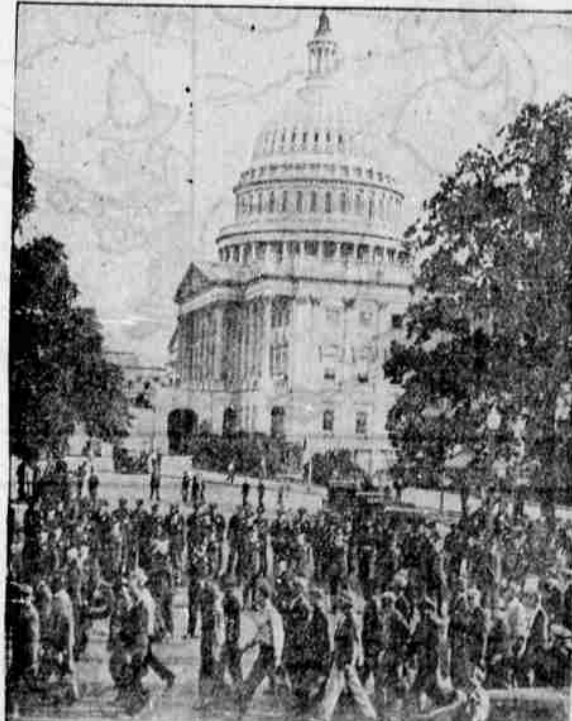
