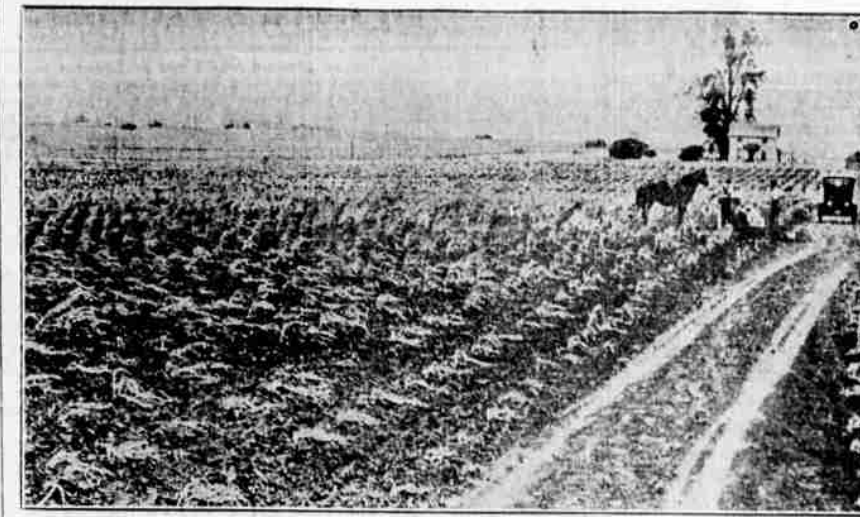
FLIEGEL DEPARTS FOR ELKS CONFAB

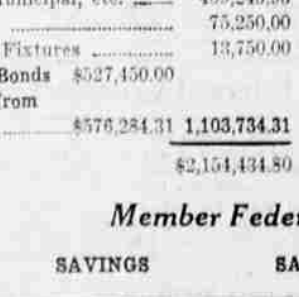

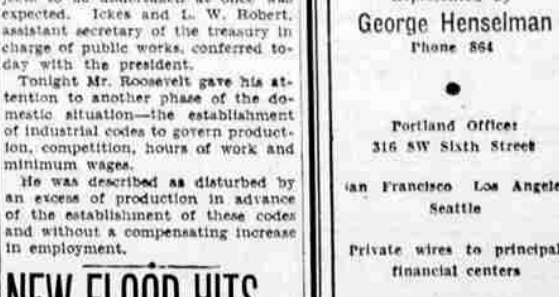
