### OREGON URGED AS SUMMER CAPITAL

PORTLAND, Ore., July 11.—(AP)—Mayor Joseph K. Carson today urged a state-wide movement looking toward the establishment in the Oregon country of a permanent "summer capital" for the president of the United States and his official family.

He proposed a popular subscription fund to provide suitable domiciliary facilities and said the plan has been mentioned at the White House and "has not been frowned upon there."

The proposal was placed before the chamber of commerce.

### AQUATIC GARDEN FOR NORMAL AT ASHLAND

ASHLAND, Ore.—An aquatic garden, 70 by 90 feet, has been constructed on the campus of the Oregon Normal school, and within two years is expected to contain hundreds of native and imported plants. It was constructed entirely by students, who did most of the work during a "campus day."

Flowers and plants have been donated, and the garden is soon expected to be one of the show places of Southern Oregon.</
