SEATTLE, July 12.—(AP)—That part of the world's featherweight championship recognized by the National Boxing Association remained today in the possession of Freddie Miller but the Cincinnati southpaw had to twice knock out Abie Israel, Seattle Jewish flash, to keep the crown in a scheduled 15-round battle here last night.

Israel's title venture ended for sure in a coast of rain on a new gasp in the fourth round when he was battered down for the third time by a crushing left.

The closest the Seattle youngster came to the N. B. A. championship was his claim to a foul in the third when he was flattened with a left uppercut to the body.

All doubt of a low blow was removed after an examination by Dr. J. S. Thomas, official boxing physician, when he said he "found no evidence of foul."
