FISH AND GAME WILL MULTIPLY IF LOAN COMES

PORTLAND, July 13.—(AP)—An increase of 50 per cent in the production of game fish and birds in state hatcheries and farms will be possible, the game commission believes, if the commission's application for a federal loan of \$120,000 under the industrial recovery act, is approved.

The production of game birds at Eugene and Pendleton farms would be increased 50 per cent under present plans, with \$24,800 to be expended on the two farms. At Medford \$3500 would be spent on a screen building plant. The 11 fish hatcheries would get \$91,700.

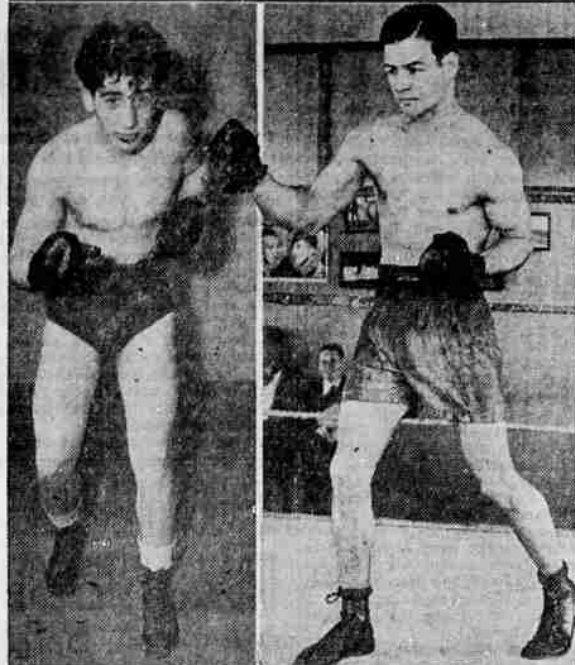

THYE TOO EAGER TO GET AT FOE

PORTLAND, Ore., July 13.—(AP)—Using body slams to take each fall, Tiny Roebuck of Chicago defeated George Nelson of Logan, Utah, in two straight falls in the main event to last night's wrestling matches here.

Roebuck's tremendous weight advantage was apparently a barrier Nelson could not surmount. Roebuck weighed 275 and Nelson 218. Roebuck took the first fall in 21 minutes and the deciding tumble in 10 minutes.

Wong Buck Cheung, 212, Chicago Chinese, won the semi-windup from Ted Thye, 193, Portland, when Thye shouldered butted Cheung while the Chinese was climbing into the ring, and the referee called it a foul. Each had taken a fall.

INTERNATIONAL DUELS IN GOLF

VANCOUVER, July 13.—(AP)—Four United States players and four from Canada lined up today for international duels in the quarter final of the Canadian amateur golf championship.

The successful invaders are Frank Dolp and Dr. Cliff Baker of Portland, Ore., and Harry Glivan and Albert "Scotty" Campbell of Seattle.

Glivan had the easiest victory yesterday, beating Jack Morrison of Vancouver, 8 and 7; but Campbell had to go to the 37th hole to defeat Jack "Finger" of San Francisco, and Dr. Baker also was carried to an extra hole by John Lewis of Branford, Ont. Dolp came from behind to defeat young Taylor of Victoria, 4 and 3.

BRITISH HEAVIES STAGE 'QUEER' GO

LONDON, July 13.—(AP)—Boxing critics today labeled as a fiasco the bout for the British heavyweight boxing championship in which Jack Peterson, holder of the Lonsdale belt, won on a foul from Irish Jack Doyle in the second round before a crowd of 80,000 in the White City stadium last night.

Doyle was disqualified after a series of low blows. After two palpably low punches which caused the referee to step in and tell Doyle he was ruled out, the challenger continued to hammer away at Peterson for several minutes. There were some wild scenes before the bout finally came to a halt.
