

90,000 ENROLLED FOR FOREST ARMY FOR WEST COAST

Young Men, Many of Whom Will Get First Taste of Manual Labor and Be in Forest for First Time

SAN FRANCISCO, July 14.—(UP)—A peace time army of more than 90,000 men, conscripted under President Roosevelt's recovery program, was scattered in eight western states, leading the recruits in the battle against the depression was General Melvin Craig, commander of the Ninth Corps Area, which contains 450 concentration camps in California, Utah, Nevada, Wyoming, Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington. He will be assisted by his chief of staff, Col. E. S. Hartshorn.

The army is composed mostly of young men, many of whom never have done manual labor or been in a forest, but General Craig was optimistic over their eagerness to tackle their job—the first they have been able to obtain since the depression began. There also were World War veterans in the camps.

"Lieut. Gen. Hunter Liggett once wrote that the fighters of St. Mihiel and the Marne were self-reliant, full of courage, intelligence and energy, and I am happy to say these men also have those attributes," said General Craig.

"Faced with a life new to most of them, they have shown great ingenuity in making life comfortable, and in eliminating as far as possible the friction inherent in outdoor existence."

The forest camp "soldiers" will have an opportunity to advance. Although regulations provide for a cash allowance of \$30 a month, it was announced eight per cent may be paid \$45, and an additional eight per cent \$35. Men chosen for the higher wage bracket will become overseers.

14 DIE, 332 HURT IN AUTO SMASHES

SALEM, July 14.—(AP)—Motor vehicle accidents during June numbered 1439 in Oregon, claiming 14 lives and injuring 332 others, the secretary of state announced today.

Last year in June there were 1690 accidents, resulting in 385 injuries and 16 deaths.

Fewer accidents were reported for the first six months this year than last. Accidents numbered 8946, persons injured 1780 and fatalities 104, as compared to 10,887 accidents, 2111 persons injured and 103 fatalities for the first half of 1932.

Division of fatalities shows pedestrian, collision with railroad trains and non-collision accidents claimed three lives each. Motorcycle, bicycle and motor vehicle accidents claimed other lives last month.

BANK CLEARINGS OVER COUNTRY INCREASING

NEW YORK, July 14.—(AP)—Bank clearings for the country last week rose to \$5,351,857,000 compared with \$4,125,894,000 for the corresponding period last year. Dun & Bradstreet, Inc., reported today. The gain in New York was 48.4 per cent, with the aggregate for centers out of New York up 3.2 per cent.

OREGON GUARDSMEN AMONG HEALTHIEST

SALEM, July 14.—(AP)—The Oregon National Guard personnel is among the healthiest of the nation, war department figures received at the guard headquarters here today revealed. The sick cost per man for the end of the fiscal year was but four cents. The national average was 30 cents.

The guardsmen of Oregon rated fourth in the entire United States, in the health program, with South Dakota, Kentucky and Vermont topping them on the list.

MEAT DEALERS' MEET SLATED FOR SUNDAY

AUTOISTS TOLD HOW TO OBTAIN DRIVERS CARDS

The realization that all drivers' licenses issued before July 1, 1931, will be automatically cancelled by law on September 1 has awakened active interest in many motorists, reports Hal E. Hosa, secretary of state. The most common question asked at his office is: "What must I do to get a new license?"

Anticipating that this information will be more in demand as the expiration date on all old licenses draws near, Mr. Hosa has issued a brief formula for obtaining a new-type license.

First—The applicant must obtain the standard application blank from the secretary of state or from local examination headquarters, state police, sheriff's office, or chamber of commerce.

Second—He must fill out the form in full and sign it in the presence of a notary public or other person authorized to administer oaths. All state examiners are notaries public and will perform this service without charge.

Third—The applicant must file the completed form by September 1, either by leaving it with an examiner or by sending it to the secretary of state at Salem. In either case, a payment of \$1 must accompany the application.

Each of the requirements are provided by law and no license can be issued unless all are complied with, it was stated.

UNLUCKY THIRTEEN NO HOODOO TO RAILROAD RECORD FOR SAFETY

The unlucky number thirteen has been no hoodoo to the safe handling of passengers on Southern Pacific trains.

This hurdling of a jinx was revealed today in the announcement by J. H. Dyer, vice president of the railroad, that the company has completed thirteen years without having a fatality among its passengers due to a steam-train accident on its 9000 miles of lines in six western states.

In establishing this remarkable record in the safe handling of passengers, the railroad has transported 489,534,090 persons during the thirteen years an accumulative distance of 19,517,948,155 miles, of the equivalent of 783,700 times around the earth, Dyer stated.

The fact that the operation of every train over the railroad's main trunk lines is protected by automatic block signals, a precaution in which Southern Pacific leads all other railroads in the world, is declared by Dyer to be an important factor in making the safety record possible.
