Slouch Hats, Tailored Lines Give Frocks Mannish Touch



Chocolate Drops.
"They say" these days that men belong to the Sweeter Sex. The proof for this statement is provided by the records of candy shops where men are doing the heavy buying of candy bars, especially chocolate bars. Ten thirty in the morning and about four o'clock in the afternoon find the candy merchants busy supplying the chocolate candy desires of men all over the country. These are periods of low vitality and nibbling a few bits of the delectable chocolate bar is a favorite method of quickly picking up a fresh supply of energy. Another popular use of chocolate is the flavoring of milk for children who dislike the taste of plain milk. However, one does not need to look for reasons to use chocolate. It is perhaps the most popular flavor at the present writing and any dish showing the rich brown color is sure to be a favorite in any gathering.

Molded Pudding.
2 tablespoons gelatine
1 cup cold milk
2 cups milk, scalded
1-3 cup sugar
1/4 cups ground chocolate
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup whipped cream.
Soak the gelatine in cold milk while scalding the two cups of milk. Combine sugar, salt and chocolate and add to the hot milk. When boiling remove from heat and add the cold milk with gelatine. Cool and when about to set, add the whipped cream and vanilla with folding action. Pour into molds and chill. Garnish with dot of whipped cream flavored with mint.

Chocolate Meringues.
3 egg whites
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1/4 cup sugar
3/4 tablespoons ground chocolate
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
Vanilla ice cream.
Beat egg whites until frothy then add cream of tartar and continue beating until stiff. Sift together sugar and chocolate and add gradually to first mixture, folding until well mixed. Add vanilla. Drop from teaspoon on floured tin. Bake one hour at 275 degrees. Place one on each side of a slice of ice cream for a serving.

Chocolate Maple Sauce.
(For Cake or Ice Cream)
1 1/2 cups evaporated milk
3/4 teaspoon gelatine
2 teaspoons cold water
1 cup maple syrup
1/2 cup ground chocolate
4 egg yolks
1 teaspoon vanilla
F. G. salt.
Scald the milk. Soften gelatine in cold water, add to hot milk and stir until dissolved. Heat syrup and chocolate in double boiler, mix well and pour over egg yolks. Stir until slightly thickened, then chill. Beat the chilled milk until thickened, add vanilla and salt, then blend thoroughly with chocolate mixture. Chill and serve on ice cream or cake.

Chocolate Milk Shake.
1 cup evaporated milk
3 tablespoons chocolate syrup
Cracked ice
1 teaspoon grated orange rind.
Syrup—
1 1/2 cups cocoa
1 cold water
2 cups sugar
2 teaspoons vanilla
F. G. salt.
Cook cocoa and water together, stirring until smooth and to the boiling point, stir in sugar and salt and continue cooking until they are dissolved. Boil three minutes, add flavoring and cool.

Chocolate Sunshine Cake.
2 1/2 cup egg whites
1/4 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup egg yolks
3/4 cup flour
1/4 cup cocoa
1 1/4 cups sugar.
Beat whites with salt and cream of tartar. Fold in sifted sugar and vanilla. Beat yolks to light, thick stage and fold into first mixture. Finally fold in the flour and cocoa which have been sifted five times. Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Place cake in oven and roast to 350 degrees. Bake one hour.

Quick Chocolate Cake.
2 eggs
1/2 cup milk
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup cake flour

1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
2 sq. unsweetened chocolate
1/2 cup shortening.
Melt chocolate and shortening. Sift together the flour and baking powder. Mix the beaten eggs, milk, sugar and vanilla, then combine all and beat one minute with rotary beater. Bake in a loaf at 375 degrees for 45 minutes.

Devil's Food Waffles.
1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1/2 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 1/2 cup flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup ground chocolate
4 tablespoons boiling water.
Cream shortening with sugar, whip in beaten eggs, then add milk alternately with sifted flour, salt and baking powder. Soften chocolate with the boiling water, add vanilla and stir into the mixture. Bake 4 minutes. Serve with syrup or sliced bananas and cream.

REPEAL INITIATIVE BACKERS SHOWN IN REPORT OF COSTS

SALEM, July 14.—(AP)—The first report of expenditure for circulation of initiative or referendum petitions required under a new act was filed today with the secretary of state. Initiative for the repeal of the two state prohibition amendments cost \$2,519.18 this report stated.

George Bylander, who filed the initiative report, however, failed to make an estimate of the money to be expended between the completing of the petitions and the election. Request for this estimate was made by the department of state.

Contributions toward the expenditure totaled the same amount, the report showed. Petition circulators received amounts ranging from \$20 to \$100.

Among the larger contributors were the Henry Weinhard company, Portland, \$180; California State Brewery association, \$500; Multnomah Hotel Operating company, \$100; John W. Blodgett, Jr., \$100; Portland Hotel company, Imperial Hotel, Heathman Hotel, New Heathman hotel and Western Stopper company each contributed \$50.

Report of expenditure on the referendum against the four-cent oleomargarine tax has not yet been received. This is the only other report to be filed on measures to be voted upon on July 21. All other measures on the ballot were referred by the state legislature.

Divorce Granted—According to the Grants Pass Daily Courier, a divorce decree was signed in the Josephine county circuit court yesterday by Judge Harry D. Norton for Marguerite R. Rush, when she appeared with Gus Newbury as attorney in the suit, uncontested by C. R. Rush. It was agreed the household furniture should go to Mrs. Rush, and conditional sales contracts and other indebtedness to be assumed by Mr. Rush. Custody of Charles R. Rush, Jr., was awarded the mother, and it was provided that Rush contribute \$20 a month to the child's support until he is 16, unless the court should rule otherwise. The Grants Pass couple was married in Jackson county in May, 1926.
