Lake took up the mound burden at that point and held the Giants fairly well for the remainder of the battle, which was called in the eighth due to darkness.

Local fans saw some clever short-stopping as displayed by "Half-Pint" Wiggins of the Giants, who covered his territory with a speed and dash seldom seen outside the major ball parks. "Old" Charlie Ackers, third baseman, also proved a revelation for the cash customers by his work around the hot corner.
