

# Jiu Jitsu Exponent Will Meet Ted Thye on Armory Mat Tonight

## BELCASTRO AND KOVERLY ALSO ON HIGH CLASS CARD

Jiu jitsu, the art of wrestling in Japanese terms, will be the chief drawing card at the armory tonight when Ted Thye, Portland wrestler, meets Oki Shikina, a Japanese matman, in a best two out of three falls.

Thye is no novice in the art of jiu jitsu himself, having turned back some of the most formidable Japanese invaders. He really doesn't care which way he wrestles, so long as his opponent isn't too easy and, according to press reports, Oki is "ok" when it comes to taking care of himself on the mat.

The first 20 minutes of the match will be ordinary wrestling, or catch-as-catch-can. The second 20 minutes will be regular jiu jitsu, and the third 20 minutes will be determined by which wrestler wins a fall in the shortest length of time. All in all, fans are promised something different.

Pete Belcastro, the scrappy Italian boy from Sacramento, will meet Geo. Koverly, both well known here, although Belcastro is better known than is Koverly, who has wrestled here only once. Belcastro, however, has a way of making the fans hate him, so he is a popular favorite with the fans. Action and lots of it, is Belcastro's secret of success.

Koverly is more inclined to really "wrestle" and let the rough stuff go by the boards, but he'll have a tough time wrestling with Belcastro, who craves action.

Mack Lillard, promoter, said this morning that Oki Shikina has proved a more than popular favorite wherever he has wrestled, and is considered one of the best jiu jitsu wrestlers in the heavyweight class.

The matches start at 9 o'clock.

## DE MAGGIO FAILS TO HIT IN 62ND

For almost two months Joe De Maggio banged out at least one hit off every Coast league pitcher who faced him, hit safely in 61 consecutive games to better by 12 the former 49-game league record set by Oakland's Jack Neas in 1915.

Yesterday the remarkable Seal youngster, an 18-year-old newboy playing his first season in organized baseball, went hitless, stopped by Oakland fielding and the steady pitching of Ed Walsh, son of the great Ed Walsh of Chicago White Sox fame.

In five times at bat Joe grounded out twice, forced Jimmy Zinn at second base, and flied out twice. The kid outfielder failed to hit safely in his fifth time at bat, but his long fly to Foul scored Jack Featon to give San Francisco a 5-4 victory over Oakland.

In his 61-game batting streak De Maggio hit 104 times in 255 times at bat for an average of .405. His 104 hits included 17 doubles, six triples and 11 home runs.

## CANTONWINE PINS NELSON FOR WIN

PORTLAND, Ore., July 27.—(P)—After losing the first fall to George Nelson of Provo, Utah, Howard Cantonwine of Portland came back to take the next two in and win the main event on last night's wrestling program here. Cantonwine weighed 230 and Nelson, 215.

Nelson used an airplane spin to take the first fall in 16 minutes. Cantonwine evened the match in 12 minutes and won the deciding fall in five minutes, using a body slam for each fall.

Oki Shikina, 200, Japan, and Wong Buck Chung, 219, each got a fall in the semi-windup and were awarded a draw.

Benny Martin, 155, Edgewater, Okla., won the opener from Dick Lefebre, 154, Portland, getting one fall.

## AMATEUR BOXERS ENROLL TONIGHT FOR BIG TOURNEY

Amateur boxers move into the spotlight in Medford tonight when this city's stout-hearted and aspiring huskies, and those from points nearby, swarm to the legion's open-air arena in the playgrounds east of the Main street bridge at 7:30 to enroll for free training and for a chance to represent their community, city and state in the American Legion's great relief fund Golden Gloves championship amateur boxing tournament to be offered on the Medford armory field of honor here nights of Aug. 14, 15, and 16.

Amateurs in other points in southern Oregon are requested to mail in their name, age, and weight to Carl Y. Tengwald, chairman of the relief fund tourney committee, Medford, at once.

It will cost nothing to sign up tonight, learn how to box from Les. Showers and Dick Russell, and to try for the elegant trophies, and trips to other tourneys pointing to the national championships, that go to the winners.

A number of towering heavyweights are expected among the huskies to enroll tonight. The Dempsey trophy beckons the big fellows into the folds of the huge tourney here. Elaborate awards go to victors in all other weight classes, too.

On the three nights of the tourney, the Medford amateurs will join forces in a mighty fistie drive against the out-of-town warriors. There will be from 15 to 20 wild-eyed fights in all weight divisions on each night of the huge fistie revival. The fights will be for three rounds each and are to be put on in rapid-fire order, with the first starting at promptly 8:15 and the last struggle to end not later than 10:30.

As the Medford amateurs organize tonight, those within a radius of 100 miles of this city, too, will be mobilizing for their invasion of the armory here in quest of the championships when the hostilities get under way. The same brand of thrilling amateur fights that attract San Francisco, Los Angeles, New York, Boston, Kansas City, and other large fistie centers will be dished up to the ring devotees of southern Oregon when the curtain goes up on the huge tournament here.
