

COUNTIES SENDING GREATER NUMBER FOR STATE'S CARE

Commitments to Institutions Grow From 17.69 to 19.77 Per Cent for 1000 Population in Past Ten Years

SALEM, July 27.—(P)—Commitments to five state institutions in Oregon during the past 10 years have increased from 17.69 per 1000 population to 19.77, a report just prepared for state officials revealed.

Marion county, which had the largest per capita attendance in the 10 years preceding 1921, due to many counties sending such persons to Salem and letting the Marion county court commit them, dropped from 26 per thousand to 21 in the five institutions.

Other counties showing decreases were Baker, from 21 to 19; Gilliam, from 18 to 17; Harney from 18 to 12; Malheur from 19 to 14; Sherman from 11 to 10; Union from 19 to 18.5 and Wasco from 22 to 21. Wheeler county remained the same at 10 persons.

Umatilla during the past 10 years sends the most to these institutions, averaging 28 out of every thousand population, an increase during this time of four persons. The greatest increase in commitments was reported from Lincoln county, jumping from nine to 17. Jackson county increased from 14 to 22 per thousand.

Records from the remaining counties, also showing increases were: Benton from 14 to 15; Clatsop from 13 to 15; Columbia from 13 to 15; the three counties of Crook, Deschutes and Jefferson, compiled together, 10 to 15; Curry from 15 to 16; Grant from eight to 13; Hood River from 15 to 16; Lake from 13 to 14; Linn from 13 to 15; Morrow from nine to 13; Polk from 14 to 18; Tillamook from 12 to 19; Wallowa from nine to 13; Washington from 15 to 16 and Yamhill from 14 to 17.

TRIPLE OBJECTIVE IN PROPOSAL FOR ADEQUATE SEWER

Hamilton Patton, member of the committee of the chamber of commerce, which worked out the plans for the sewer bond issue which citizens will vote next Friday, in an interview this morning made the following statement:

"The Chamber of Commerce had three things in mind in developing this public works committee, the suggested scheme to the city council for the bond issue on the sewage disposal plant which is to be voted on Friday.

"In line with the desires of the president and congress in working out a better scheme of taking care of unemployment than the dale system,

which has been customary in recent months and has been severely criticized, the directors have already entered upon a public works program. All heads of relief work believe that inasmuch as money must be spent for unemployment relief, something definitely constructive should be the result of the expenditure. This project will put men to work and get something for the money spent. This is especially true since \$30,000 of the sum will be an outright donation from the government.

"Last year the city lost certain law suits and paid damages, due to the condition of the sewage disposal system now used. These disposal suits will continue and the amounts awarded will increase considerably, causing a greater cash outlay than the annual bond retirement schedule necessary.

"No one who has any interest in living in a healthy community can consider our present disposal system satisfactory. This reason alone should necessitate the voting of the bonds.

"The committee would raise out a scheme that would not raise current expenditures of the people paying the retirement schedule called

for this was done through the cooperation of the water department and the city council, which has already been explained. The combined monthly charge for the water and the retirement of the sewage bonds will be the same as the present water rate. If the people vote the bonds, the cost of the plant is in line with today's price, and the people are asked to vote an issue of between one-quarter and one-third of what was suggested in the last election when placed before them for their consideration. The chamber of commerce suggests that everyone get out and vote on Friday and support the measure."
