

### FEHL'S WITNESS TRIES TO ARGUE CASE ON STAND

Mrs. T. J. Enright testified that Fehl was at her home discussing tax matters with her husband, between 7 and 7:30, on the evening of the vote-stealing.

Mrs. Fehl in her cross-examination admitted that Fehl, Banks and Mrs. Martin had addressed many rural "congress" meetings.

**LaDieu Testifies**

J. Arthur LaDieu, former business manager for the Banks newspaper testified that the meeting in the county court office was for the purpose of arranging bonds for Banks on indictments charging criminal libel and criminal contempt. He said he was not present all of the session. LaDieu testified that Jones, Fehl, Amos W. Walker and Banks were present, and when Sheriff Schermerhorn, convicted of the same charge as Fehl is accused, returned from securing the approval of the court to the bonds, he was accompanied by Attorney Elton Watkins of Portland, attorney for Schermerhorn in the recount proceedings. LaDieu said when the meeting dispersed Watkins and Schermerhorn went to the sheriff's office.

Mrs. Fannie May Brown corroborated the testimony of her daughter, Mrs. Martin.

The trial has speeded up, and it is now expected that the chief defense case will be completed by Wednesday noon.

### CENTRAL POINT ON NRA BASIS TODAY

Merchants of Central Point met last night at the office of The American, the town's newspaper, and by unanimous vote, endorsed the National Recovery Administration program of President Roosevelt and agreed to comply with all its phases.

Pointing out that the president is desirous of increasing work and business, they agreed upon 8:00 a. m. to 6:00 p. m. as open hours for stores every day but Saturday, and 8:00 a. m. to 3:00 p. m. for that day. By so doing they will increase their overhead, and to comply with the president's wage agreement will increase the number of employees serving the public, which they described today as "the real object of the president's program."

Central Point is primarily an agricultural center. It was also pointed out, and the extra hours' service on Saturday night will mean much to that particular area.

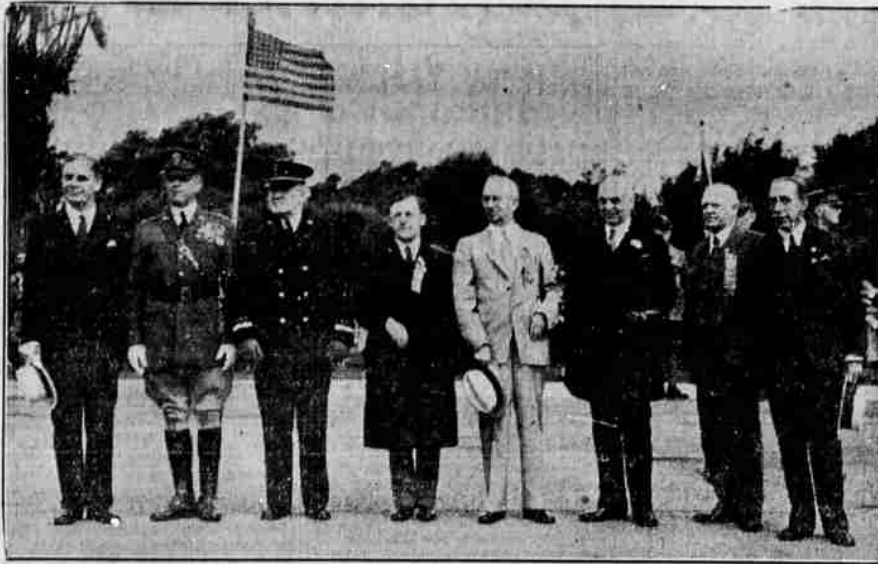
### LAKEVIEW PLANS THREE-DAY RODEO

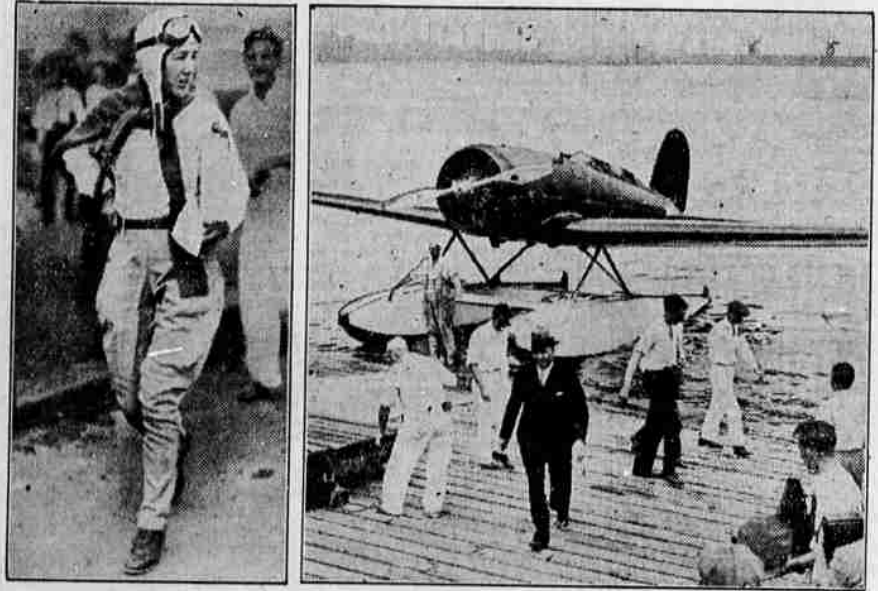
