Mayor and Friends Hope to Have Tough Entries in Legion's Fight Festival — Fans Will Cool Arena

Declaring "We want our Grants Pass amateurs in shape to clean the floors of the Medford fighters," Mayor W. W. Stockwell of Grants Pass has turned ristic mentor as he and Dr. Byron G. Bailey and Charles Gillette get the hunkies of that city in trim for the American Legion's great relief fund benefit Golden Gloves championship amateur boxing tournament to be offered in the Medford Armory nights of August 14, 15 and 16.

Mayor Stockwell has announced that the largest number of ring devotees ever to attend an out-of-town ring show will come to Medford to support the Grants Pass ringmen in the opening round of the huge mitt-fest August 14.

Fans to Cool Arena. In order to assure the spectators comfort, Carl Tengwald, chairman of the Legion tourney committee, today announced that electric fans will be installed throughout the Armory arena on nights of the tourney to keep the battle front cool. He also pointed out that for the first time since ring events have been held in the Armory the windows to the arena will not be clogged up by interested fans looking on from the outside.

From 15 to 20 exciting three-round rights in all weight classes will make up the bill on each night of the mighty ring class, Les Showers, tourney director, promises. Oregon's favorite fighting men will be seen tearing into the "arena" from Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky and other states.

Former College Mat Champ Wants Broccoli King to Stay in Ring and Wrestle — Karasick Meets Wolfe

Medford wrestling fans are awaiting the gong Thursday night that will start the match between Bob Kruse, the putting ploughboy of Oswego, and Everett Kibbens of Stillwater, Oklahoma, former "big ten" champion while he was in college.

Kibbens is no hand for foolishness. It is understood, and he likes to wrestle. He has declared that the first time Kruse gets outside the ropes just for a stroll around the ring, that he'll go out after him and see if he'd rather wrestle on the fans or on the mat. Kruse, it will be remembered, has a very provoking habit of dodging outside the ropes when danger threatens.

Aside from the Kruse-Kibbens go, Al Karasick will meet Les Wolfe of Dallas, Texas, the undisputed heavyweight champion of the Panhandle. Karasick is a headliner on any man's wrestling card and Mack Lillard, promoter, declared yesterday that Thursday's card should be one of the best he has ever put on here.

Karasick, the old Russian Lion, was undisputed light-heavyweight champion of the world until he got to putting on weight and had to go into the heavy class. He was defeated by Kruse in a bout here recently, and has stated he would reinstate himself in the eyes of Medford Thursday by giving Wolfe a mauling.

The bout will start at nine o'clock, as in the past, Lillard said.
