

Big Shot Grapplers of Coast Will Perform on Armory Card Tonight

KRUSE, KARASICK TO SHOW WARES ON DOUBLE CARD

Oswego Muscle Mangler Meets Kibbens White Russian Lion Tackles Les Wolfe—Opens At 9 P. M.

Medford wrestling fans will see two of the coast's leading matmen in action here tonight when Bob Kruse meets Everett Kibbens, former Big Ten champion, and Al Karasick meets Les Wolfe of Dallas, Texas, the heavyweight champion claimant of that state.

Both Kibbens and Wolfe are new here, and little is known of their ability, except the championships held by each. Plenty is known, however, of Kruse and Karasick, each being known as among the leading action and such men of the game.

Wolfe is the recognized heavyweight champion of Texas, having held that honor some time. Karasick plans to add the Texas title to his already long list of honors when the two meet tonight.

Kruse is staging a strenuous campaign with an eye to meeting Strangler Lewis again, as he took one fall from the former champion last time they met, and lost the match by but a small margin. Marked improvement is noticed in the wrestling of Kruse, and Oregon now has one of the leading contenders for the heavyweight honors.

As in the past, the matches will start at nine o'clock.

Fishing Lines

Hints for Those Who Angle in Southern Oregon Waters

Good trout fishing is reported on the south fork of upper Rogue river, where anyone who can fish at all can get his limit in a short while. The limit on the trout is 30 fish in a day, or 50 in a week. They are mostly between five and seven inches in length.

Dean S. Ashton, editor of the Everett, Wash., Herald, has written local friends that he plans to come here early this month to do some steelhead fishing in the Rogue river. "The only thing," he wrote, "is that you shouldn't put ballots in the river, because the ink makes the fish dizzy."

Dr. R. C. Mulholland claims the honor of catching the second largest German brook trout of the season. Fishing Crater lake Sunday, he brought from its intense blue a trout weighing 8 1/2 pounds. He also caught his limit for the day and describes fishing in the world wonder as excellent.

The fish are more scrappy than ever in Crater lake this year, he said. "I call it the best lake fishing in the state."
