

### RING FANS COMING FROM ALL POINTS FOR BIG TOURNEY

Neighboring Towns Will Be Well Represented by Best Fighters and Sportsmen Says Commander Garlock

Boxing fans from far and near, making up the largest crowd ever to assemble for a ring event in southern Oregon, will throng into town to see the big boys drop each other to earth with pile-driving wallops in the "battle of giants" that will feature the grand opening of the American Legion's great amateur boxing tournament at the Medford Armory arena here next Monday night, was the forecast of Lee Garlock, legion commander, today. The ring classic is to continue for three nights, closing on Wednesday.

From Many Points From Ashland, Gold Hill, Grants Pass, Klamath Falls, Prospect, Jacksonville, Hill, and other points—near and far away—will come flatie disciples to support their "home town" ringmen as they strive manfully to batter their way to victory over the prizes of Medford during the grueling struggles Monday night. Members of the C. C. C. camps, too, will flock into town to cheer for C. C. C. fighting men from Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, and other states as they come to war against Oregon's stout-hearted leather-pushers.

Although there will be bitter and fierce fighting in all other classes, too, Monday night, the behemoths of the ring will stand out on the card. Les Showers, tourney chief, declares the first victory in the 15 to 20 pounder way at promptly 8:15 Monday night and the last tussle is to end not later than 10:30.

Oregon vs. Enemy There'll be a hot time on the Armory battle front Monday night as an army of rugged fighters make a valiant attempt to carry the colors of Oregon through to victory in the most hectic and body wrecking ring feuds ever waged in this city's famed human sports garage. And after the smoke of battle clears away will the answer be forthcoming to the question "Does Oregon produce better fighting men than Illinois, Kentucky, Indiana, California, and other states?"

The 15 to 20 wild eyed fights will be for three rounds each with the bouts being put on in rapid-fire order. Before two warring ringsters leave the ring another pair will be seen climbing in with gloves on and rain' to resume hostilities where the others left off. Knockdowns and knockouts will be dished up in bountiful order.
